C. Business:*(Timestamp 00:01:41)*A. Kuna Arts Commission's 2025 Budget Allocation **ACTION ITEM***(Timestamp 00:01:41)*

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy Okay. Moving on to Business. Kuna Arts Commission 2025 Budget Allocation and it looks like we have an 'Action Item' there. So I'll turn that over to Leah.

Arts and History Center Curator Leah Torres Yeah. So we've been talking about budget, you know, previous meetings we spoke about at the last meeting, ideas had for participation events since pretty much each quarter with exhibits has been filled out. We have artists for each quarter. We have history exhibits for each quarter, so now sort of a focus on, you know, having events

and things like that. And I know commissioners have been wanting to see for the money we had for that, so I presented this. As I've said before, we have \$25,000. The Arts Commission has a \$25,000 budget for the fiscal year 2025. And so, this allocation breakdown releases ways that we can allocate that budget. So that you know more so what money could be used for events, for facilities, for, you know, the things that are outlined here. And if that looks good to you guys or if you have any thoughts? You know, let me know. And then you would, if you approve it, you would take a vote and yeah, but what do you if you have any ideas, thoughts, it looks good.

Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson To clarify, Commissioners, you'd be able to find this on page 15 of the packet if you scroll on your. If you don't bend your necks, sorry.

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy Thank you.

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus Page 15.

Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson That is correct.

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus I didn't see it in here. Page 5?

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy No. There.

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus Oh, Okay.

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy Okay.

[Short Pause]

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus All the utilities in all of the other insurance and etcetera were all taken out of a different P&L line I take it because some of this is just for like exhibit openings, so for Leah. The art history building A total subset.

Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson That's a separate line item within the budget of the City, and it's not. It's distinct and separate from this \$25,000.

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus Just clarification. What did we spend last year?

Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson There was no money as far as I'm aware, which was taken from the \$25,000 budget last year. Because it doesn't roll over we're still at that \$25,000.

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy And if we take a look at this and we approve how it is set up currently, does that mean that we could not at some point readjust some of those or is this sort of this is where we think we might be, and this is where we presume to have those funds. How would that work?

Arts and History Center Curator Leah Torres Yeah. So, if you would approve this and they would be, they would be allocated for those, you know be that \$8000 for facilities, \$10,000 for

participation events. And if you don't, you know approve it, then you don't approve it. Or if you do, you do. But yeah, I... That would be where these funds are allocated.

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy So if for example, we didn't spend \$5000 on a procuring artists we could not necessarily move that into a participation demonstration or something? Is that correct?

Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson That's correct, because it was specifically tailored for that public or for precuring artist, it would have to be spent in that manner. At a later date, you could come through with a... We could come through with a separate... A separate Addendum or adjustment or allocation to adjust, but it would have to be approved in the same manner in which this is being approved. We couldn't as a City, if you guys approved it, just willy nilly, just change what was approved for what.

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy Thank you. So, Leah, can you talk just a little bit about how you came up with the dollar amounts that you did for this budget?

Arts and History Center Curator Leah Torres Yeah. So, I just sort of, you know took what we had been discussing at previous meetings and looked at how much money we had and what are the goals that you've all expressed. So that's why I put, you know, a lot of the budget in participation because, as a way that's the focus here, printing in posters and things that would be for like openings or if we needed you know banners for anything. So that would be used for that. Public art because you know you've expressed interest in murals and things, and that's public art. That's why I put some money towards that. Facilities, we're looking at getting that sign as we've spoken about for the building so that would be the money for facilities. But yeah, it's just taking what you guys have spoken about and trying to figure out amounts that would work.

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus In regard to the first line item for facilities, is that something that needs to come out of the first quarter budget or is that something you plan on using or is that something as a let's say as needed, because rails needed for safety reasons or concrete needed to be leveled basically.

Arts and History Center Curator Leah Torres So rail speaks to rails that would hang artwork. Doesn't speak to rails outside.

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus Okay. And despite it. So that's where I just had a disconnect. Thank you.

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy And for clarification, is this the. This is the annual budget, is that correct? So, it's not a first quarter, second...

Arts and History Center Curator Leah Torres Yeah. Yeah, it's annual. It's for the year, fiscal year.

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy Okay.

[Short Pause]

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus I like where it's at. Once I had my question verified. Now I know the rails are fixed.

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy I would anticipate at some point the difference between the amount that goes into facilities and the amount that goes into like the participation in the public art, even the media and printing might shift as facilities become more complete. Okay.

Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson We're anticipating having to upgrade that sunroom to make it ADA compliant. So once that is. Once that is taken care of. I think you will see that facilities budget drop and be moved towards other projects as well. Which towards more art based and history-based projects.

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy Thank you.

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus And one thing I don't see in there, just for discussion purposes, is grants right for artists, sculptors, and well, I maybe that can, you know, persistent participation. Leah, you did a very good job on this. I'm just wondering where grants would fit into this. Public Art or...

Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson Do you want...

Arts and History Center Curator Leah Torres Yeah, so are you speaking about grants for artists at the Arts Commission would do?

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus Yeah.

Arts and History Center Curator Leah Torres You know, we've spoken about this before, and I've talked to the City Clerk, and he said we wouldn't be able to do grants for artists out of this budget. We would not be able to do it.

Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson What could be done with that is the purchase of products for the center where people could come, or artists could come to the center and use the products there. So, that is where we would probably see grants for artists moving forward is allocating art supplies for the center and then the artist coming to the center to use them. Versus handing out grants to or pieces to artists. Off of the way of city finance laws work.

2nd Vice Chair Tom Matus Thank you. Yeah.

Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy Any other questions or discussion? Then I presume we need to make a motion to accept.

**Arts and History Center Curator Leah Torres** Yes, so I have. In the packet I have the sort of little flyers that I put out for these new exhibits that are going up on the 22<sup>nd</sup>, running through April 4th. **Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy** That would be kind of a nice thing to have the artist present too.

**Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson** So \$5000 or \$1000 just to make sure we're on the same page, sorry.

**Chairwoman DebAnn Rippy** So we're saying maximum of \$5000 regardless of how many pieces it is, is that correct?

**Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson** Okay. If you want, I mean that's. Not to exceed 5000 and with however many pieces.

**Deputy City Clerk Garrett Michaelson** Okay.


