Mayor Stear Next we have public comment. David Wardell, If you would just state your name and address for the record.

City Clerk Nathan Stanley Can you say it into the mic so we can get it on the recording, please? Thank you.

Council President Bruce *And is it green?*

Mayor Stear *Yeah, push the base there..*

David Wardell *That was easy.*

Mayor Stear Okay, now go.

David Wardell David Wardell, 2230 East Condor Lane, Kuna. I came to discuss a little bit of issues that I have with the Building Department, and just a few minutes ago, Mayor Stear informed me that there are some changes being made, and so I am compelled to cut back on my rhetoric, considerably. But I would like to comment that at this time, in this jurisdiction, you have absolutely no code compliant construction going on. My understanding, that's going to change. I hope so. That's why I came in. There have been many errors, not only in plan check, but also in inspections. Again, I've been told that's going to change. I hope so. The building department is going to need your support because if they start doing what I've been told they're going to start doing, and in fact enforcing the code, the builders are going to scream. And they're going to be on you. And I hope that you will support your people and not succumb to politics. Because that's one of the reasons that these people back off, I talked to a lot of superintendents here in this area and in other areas, their whole general and almost 100% attitude is we don't care about the code. As long as we can get away with it and make money at it, we're going to keep doing it. And if you start making them do it correctly, it's going to cost more and that's going to be a problem.

So, I urge you to please support your Building Department and Planning & Zoning and all those and let them know that as long as they stay in the code, you're going to back them. So anyway, that's the big thing I have discussed earlier with your Building Official. He said that the workforce out there is very poor. Mostly, much of it is unskilled and untrained, which is true. I've worked around the world in many, mostly in third world countries, and the workforce that's out here right now, building in this jurisdiction is not much better in the general framing areas. These people will improve if the code is enforced. They will not ever improve if the code maintains what you're doing, what has been done. So, I certainly hope that everyone will rise to the occasion and give the people in this town what they have every right to expect is a code compliant home when they buy one. The building code represents the worst, the lousiest house you're allowed to build by state law. It's a good house, but it's the lowest level of quality that you're allowed to build. None of them currently being built meet that standard.

City Clerk Nathan Stanley Sir, you've reached your time. If you can wrap up your comments.

David Wardell *Thank you.* That's just, I hope you give them some support and quite frankly, I would be more than happy to assist if anyone has any questions later on what's going on. I am a certified building inspector and have 50 years' experience as a builder. So, I do know a little bit.

Council President Bruce Thank you.

Mayor Stear Thank you very much. Michael Law.

Michael Law Michael Law, I reside at 892 North Cranesville Avenue here in Kuna. Just wanted to make a quick statement on the resolution that you just passed on the cooperative agreement between Valley Regional Transit and the City of Kuna. I wholeheartedly disagree with that. Why? Because that is not the proper role of government. It is not to provide transportation or anything else or provide the means for anybody else, especially from somebody like myself who doesn't ever commute. Traffic is not a problem for me, but yet if we continue to push public transportation, I'm still going to be paying for it and that is called extortion, when you take money and do not provide a service. Is it available? Yes, but it's not something that I need or want. Just to remind you, the proper role of government is to, is to provide, not to provide anything, but to protect life, liberty, and property. We all, you all, took an oath to defend and protect the Constitution of the United States, and that is the purpose of government as the declaration very clearly lays out. It is to protect life, liberty, and property, not to provide for any of that. It is only to protect, and this is not protecting, this is providing, and that is not a proper role of government, and that's all I have to say.

Mayor Stear And that takes us to public hearing for case #24-08-AN and #24-05-S. Troy, you may have the floor, sir. *Oh, you even get to sit down this time. That's awesome.*

Senior Planner Troy Behunin Yes, thank you, Mr. Mayor. I am sitting tonight instead of standing Good evening, Mr. Mayor, and Members of the Council. For the record, Troy Behunen, Kuna Development Services Department, Senior Planner. The applications before you this evening request annexation of approximately 79 acres and to apply the R-6 and the C-1 zones. The applicant is also requesting a preliminary plat approval in order to subdivide the site into 354 single-family lots and 38 common lots, 20 -- 12 common driveways, a school lot, and also a city park lot. The site is located near the southwest corner of Ten Mile and Kuna Roads. Staff would like to highlight that this developer is working with Kuna Royal Fire District and a Charter School for an onsite school lot and also a city park. The applicant has made adjustments to the site to accommodate also a 40 foot wide Boise Project Border Control easement along this the Sunbeam and Bead Lily frontages for at least part of the frontages and an exhibit demonstrating that cross-section of those specific frontages are in the Council's packet. Staff has reviewed the proposed annexation and the preliminary plat applications for compliance with Kuna City Code, Idaho State Statutes, the Kuna Comprehensive Plan, and should the council approve the annexation and the preliminary plat applications, staff does recommend that the applicant be subject to the proposed recommended conditions that are outlined in staff's memo. The applicant is present tonight, and they do have a presentation which begins on page 194 of the packet, and the staff report begins on page 222, and I'll be here for any questions you might have.

Mayor Stear All right And who do we have presenting for the option?

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering Good evening, Mr. Mayor, Members of Council. My name is Stephanie Hopkins. I'm with KM Engineering. Our address is 5725 North Discovery Way in Boise. And Jamie with Kittleson is with me too. So I'll let him introduce himself.

Jamie Marcosian, Kittleson and Associates Yes, for the record, Jamie Marcosian, Kittleson and Associates, traffic engineer, 101 South Capital Boulevard, Boise, Idaho, 83702.

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering Okay, so we are thrilled to be here this evening. I was actually preparing for this presentation, looking back at the history of everything, and realized that today is my sixth-year work anniversary with KM Engineering, and this was the first project I worked on when I started working at KM. So, I've been a part of the development team from the beginning, as obviously the developer, Kittleson has been involved, and we've been fortunate enough to be able to coordinate with the city. Troy, who's been here the whole time, and various other stakeholders and folks that have been involved throughout the project for several years. So, we've made quite a few changes and think that this development is going to be a great benefit to South Kuna. The developer has a lot of experience developing in Kuna and has been able to kind of harness relationships and gather amenities and things within this development that will greatly benefit not only the residents here, but residents in Kuna overall. So, we've made changes based on the feedback we've received, not only recently with Planning & Zoning Commission, but initially we'd actually planned on running this as a planned unit development. And we were going to be requesting R-12, R-6, C-1. It was going to be considerably more dense. We had 432 units. Now we have 354. We previously were going to have an attached townhome product that was going to be pretty dense. And then we decided to kind of scale that back based on feedback we'd been receiving from staff and other agencies during the time, neighbors, and also based on the feedback that we've received on other projects the developer's been working on.

So Gallica Heights was recently approved. That's one that we've been kind of watching, obviously, as this project has been evolving as well. And, you know, the PUD request was something that wasn't supported, in that application, and we realized it wouldn't be supported in this either. So, we pulled that request and have changed the plat considerably since the beginning. Notably, the future fire station lot that's in the north part. So, the north arrow is pointing to the right. This is Kuna Road. Bead Lily's on our west. That's going to be a new collector that will be constructed with this project. The fire station lot was actually already donated to the Kuna Rural Fire District ahead of a bond that they needed passed. So that was an integral piece of that bond being passed. And the developer was more than happy to do that and happy to support them in that endeavor. We have several folks from the development team here too. So, we'll address, I'll address the land use stuff and Jamie's going to cover traffic. And then if you have any further questions, we can bring other folks up and some other folks are signed in to speak as well. Troy did a wonderful job covering the basics.

So I'm going to keep it brief. Future land use is supported in this area. It's medium density residential. Our plot is 6 units per acre and we are requesting the C-1 district. So, we're asking for your approval on annexation into the C-1 district, about 2.57 acres and 76.39 acres in the R-6 district. Alongside that, we have a preliminary plat that we're requesting for approval on this evening as well. So this is the layout. We have 421 total lots. Seven of those are C-1, so that's commercial lots. And then 409 are R-6. So 354 of those are buildable. There are 306 standard single-family homes. So these are the ones that are kind of in the majority of the site. We've specifically positioned those against Sutter's Mill, which is to our east to provide a nice transition. And then there are alley loaded lots in the kind of central area here. Based on Planning & Zoning Commission's discussion the last time that we met with them. They wanted to see more open space and a pedestrian connection from south to north. So Sunbeam is a collector roadway on the south boundary of the site. We connected a pathway and increased open space opportunities through the middle and then also added some pedestrian connections that could go to the commercial area on the west side of the development. And as mentioned, there's a park lot that's included in a school lot that the developers partnering with Bloom and Sage International. They're here tonight and they'll speak. Open space is provided in excess of what code requires. So 10.5% of the overall site is required, which is about 8.29 acres. We're providing 11.7 acres, which is about 15% of the overall site of open space. There are additional buffers that have been added throughout the process and internal walkways that I've mentioned.

This is just a zoomed in version of the amenities. And then access and connectivity was a big discussion during Planning & Zoning Commission. There is a portion of right-of-way that's currently unopened, ACHD right of way that we are working through a process with them to exchange that right of way for right-of-way that will be dedicated in other areas of the site. There are two homes that currently access there, so we've included two deeded lots for them to access their homes. There's a primary access that'll be going to Kuna Road, which is on the north boundary here. That's a minor arterial roadway that will be constructed Half of this will be constructed with the development. Bead Lily's on our west boundary, that's a collector. It'll be a new north-south collector roadway that does not currently exist on the west boundary, and that will be constructed. Half of that will be constructed with this development as well. Stub streets into the subdivision and Sunbeam, which is a collector roadway on the south boundary. So, I'll turn it over to Jamie.

Jamie Marcossian, Kittleson and Associates Keeping on the lens of transportation and connectivity, we prepared a comprehensive traffic impact study, which studied the previously defined development plan, which was more dense than this. ACHD has reviewed and accepted that TIS and issued a staff report assuming those land uses. So, the land uses you see before you today are less dense, and in other words, produce less traffic than the original project did. Our comprehensive assessment here goes not only for the site frontage and adjacent intersections, but we're touching intersections and roadways up to five miles away from this site. We studied all the way up to Amity Road and all the way out to State Highway 69 with this project. We're using a combination of existing traffic counts, area growth projections through the Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho, or Compass, and the Institute of Transportation Engineers Trip Generation Manual to develop project generated trips that would be coming to and from this development.

The revised preliminary plat that you see before you with 354 residential lots is considerably less dense than the original product going from R-12 to R-6. And so, within that ACHD staff report, we have we have, you know, seen mitigations that are required, conditions of approval that are required, that include additional study of area intersections and roadways, which may include additional improvements that are required as mitigation from the developer. There will need to be a separate TIS and CUP for the school site and the study intersections and segment along Kuna Road within the study area unfortunately are not identified in the ACHD CIP or the five-year work plan. And they do meet ACHD levels of planning -- ACHD planning level of service thresholds for volumes on those classification of roadways.

Down here, you see a CIP map. So, all the circles and roadway segments that are colored within represent projects that are identified and listed in the ACHD Capital Improvements Plan. In blue, you see the various developments that are in this area. And here we are at Madrone Village, kind of, you know, in the south, the southwest corner of this aerial snip. I'll turn it back to Steph.

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering So with this development, the developer will be funding the improvements that I've mentioned earlier. So the half street connection or the half street improvement on Kuna Road, Bead Lily Avenue, which is that new collector on the west boundary, Sunbeam, which is the southern collector, and then -- So with those roadways, the developer actually be funding those and improving those with each of the phases as they come in as final plats, and that'll be required before they can get occupancy on homes and that's something that's entirely funded by the developer. And I think Jamie maybe mentioned this, but the traffic impact study or the ACHD report requires that we do a re-analysis at the 200th lot for the intersection of Black Cat and Columbia Roads. So that's going to be something that they will look at again when we have a final plat come through and they'll be able to assess whether there are additional mitigations required.

So, impact fees are another thing. The city, ACHD, the community fire district, and other agencies will collect a one-time impact fee from Madrone village to fund public improvements like roads, parks, and other services that are required. And these are necessary to serve the growth that is proposed with this. So, it's not meant to take care of existing issues. It's meant to basically, development will pay for itself, right? That's the idea. So, these impact fees

are based on the number of residences that are proposed. So, for example, ACHD has an impact fee of \$3,493. It's required per unit. So that comes out to \$1.2 million. Overall, the impact fees that this development will contribute to these different agencies is \$2.8 million, which will be obviously a huge benefit and impact to these agencies and I can go through the conceptual phasing if you'd like or I can touch on that during rebuttal but really appreciate your consideration this evening we're really excited about this project and um we're here to answer questions if you have them this project will be a really great benefit to the community and it's been a long time coming it'll be a great project, so thank you.

Mayor Stear Okay questions?

Council President Bruce Not at this time... oh, I guess.

Mayor Stear Council Member Biggs.

Council Member Biggs Yes, Stephanie, so the Planning & Zoning Commission recommended denial of this four to zero, and one was out. So, it was unanimous. And I guess the two primary concerns they brought up were traffic. They brought up the traffic that was already mentioned, and then also Kuna Road and Ten Mile intersection there. So, I guess what have you done to mitigate their concerns since June the 10th that meeting?

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering Thank you, Mayor, Councilman Biggs. I don't know that we've done any additional work to mitigate their concerns or the request. I think that during that meeting, we didn't address their concerns comprehensively. And so that's partially why we have Jamie here again. He came to the first Planning & Zoning commission meeting, wasn't available for the second. So, I was fielding a lot of traffic questions that I wasn't prepared to answer. The -- I think the main thing that we want to convey tonight is that the construction of Bead Lily Avenue, which is that new collector on the west boundary, is going to provide an alternative option for folks that would maybe take Ten Mile, otherwise, Ten Mile. The additional access is there will alleviate the current traffic that's on Ten mile. I don't know if Jamie wants to add some more information.

Jamie Marcosian, Kittleson and Associates Thank you, Jamie Marcosian. Let's see. Mr. Mayor, Councilmember Biggs, the analysis that we prepared at Ten Mile and Kuna did indicate a level of service F. In other words, a pretty significant amount of delay for folks coming from the south northbound at Ten Mile. Per ACHD policy, that intersection is a two-way stop controlled intersection. In other words, the only traffic control there is a stop sign for folks traveling northbound on Ten Mile. Within our analysis, we look at what's called a volume to capacity ratio, and it's an assessment, a calculation, et cetera, effectively, of how much volume is on the roadway versus how much volume it can process. And typically that goes in a ratio of 1.0 or less. 1.0 would be the roadway is at capacity, so it cannot accommodate additional volume. In our analysis, we are we are seeing a volume to capacity ratio of 0.86 or 86%. And what's happening within that operations analysis that leads to an LOSF, or an excessive delay, is simply the fact that there is a large volume of vehicles moving east to west on Kuna Road. And so finding a gap for folks who are headed northbound at the Ten Mile becomes a little bit difficult. It is still within the ACHD levels of service thresholds, though, given it is a two way stop controlled intersection. And because it's not part of the ACHD CIP and there still is additional capacity available on that roadway segment and at that intersection, ACHD has not conditioned additional mitigations at that location at this time.

So, there are like we talked about, there are additional traffic analyses that are impending unit count as the project would be to, would be, you know, ongoing. And so this could be one of those locations that gets rolled in. ACHD has identified the Black Cat and Columbia Road intersection in particular for that additional analysis. But those are some of the reasons why, you know, Ten Mile, Kuna came up in our traffic study, but also some of the reasons why, as we comply with ACHD's policies, it is not shown as a piece of mitigation within the project.

Council Member Biggs Is there, I guess, expectation from your study that the, I guess, the adjoining subdivision, Sutter's Mill, people are going to be used going through this one to get out?

Jamie Marcosian, Kittleston and Associates There could be. I think there are stub streets right now in Sutter's Mill that would be continued and connected within the Madrone Village project. And additionally, the Sunbeam Street collector that runs east to west on the south border of both of those developments, plus the addition of a new north-south collector at Bead Lily Avenue, offers that additional outlet capacity for folks who are in Sutter's Mill, perhaps, who need to get out to Kuna Road and can take Sunbeam to Bead Lily to access Kuna Road in that way. Typically, the most delay that you'll see at Ten Mile and Kuna is for folks who are sitting at the stop sign trying to make a left-hand turn to head westbound. The right-hand turn is a much more easy movement to control, but those left-hand turns have to navigate two directions of traffic instead of one. And so having that additional connectivity with Bead Lily Avenue and Sunbeam Street to move folks out of Sutter's Mill and Madrone up to Kuna Road is going to help the Ten Mile Kuna location.

Council Member Biggs Okay, well, thank you for that.

Jamie Marcosian, Kittleston and Associates You bet.

Council Member Biggs I guess I'll go back to Stephanie for the other concern that the zoning and zoning had. Is there gonna be a school presentation with this?

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering Mayor, Commissioner, Councilman Biggs, yes, they are here to speak.

Council Member Biggs Okay, well then I will save that.

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering Okay, thank you.

Council Member Biggs thank you.

Council Member Laraway I do have a question.

Mayor Stear Yes, Council Member Laraway.

Council Member Laraway Just a little clarification, 'cause this is the second time we've seen this, and I didn't bring it up the first time. The land that surrounds the future school, is that a city park or is that school property?

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering Mayor, Councilman Laraway, that would be a city park. The school and the city are going to have some kind of agreement and actually the school could probably provide you a little bit more information on that, but they'll have an agreement to jointly use those and it'll be the city's...

Council Member Laraway Okay, but bear with me a minute. Chief, clarification, I can open carry at a city park. But I can't open carry on school grounds. So, which is this going to be?

Council President Bruce Right.

Police Chief Mike Fratusco For the record, Mike Fratusco, Chief of Police for the city of Kuna, 793 W 4th St. You are correct. Councilman Laraway, you can carry in a park. You cannot carry out school property.

Council Member Laraway So there's going to be some confusion on that. And I know, like I said, there's only the second time we've brought this up. I didn't think about it the first time, but if this is going to become a trend there might be some clarification that we might have to deal with.

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering Sure, that's a great point. I hadn't considered that either, but I think, I mean, our development team could certainly consider and try to find a solution.

Council Member Laraway All right, thank you.

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering Thank you.

Mayor Stear Okay, anything further?

Council President Bruce I did, actually.

Mayor Stear Yes, Council Member Bruce.

Council President Bruce Thank you.

Council President Bruce When you're discussing the traffic coming off of this development, do you think that some of the traffic will be headed up Black Cat?

Jamie Marcosian, Kittleson and Associates Mayor Stear, Councilman Bruce, yes, for sure. Black Cat serves as a key north-south corridor to get folks across Indian Creek Railroad and up to places, you know, towards the interstate. From a just ease of use perspective, probably a lot more efficient for someone to head up Black Cat towards those destinations to the north, as it would be to slog through downtown Kuna and then make their way over to Highway 69 to head northbound there. Certainly, people will go east to head north. But given the location of this project and the access that Black Cat provides to the north, we do anticipate a good amount of vehicles traveling north-south on Black Cat Road.

Council President Bruce And that was just, and that's what I was thinking as well, because I think we have about at least five developments that are being built up Black Cat now. So it's something to think about of the traffic as it trends west and goes north. So, thank you.

Mayor Stear All right, anything further for the applicant?

Council Member Laraway No, sir.

Mayor Stear All right, thank you. All right, this is a public hearing. Is there anybody who wishes to testify that didn't get a chance to sign in on this sheet? Okay. We'll start with Keith Donahue. If you would just state your name and address for the record, please, sir.

Keith Donahue Yes, thank you, Mr. Mayor, and Council Members. I am Keith Donahue. I reside at 1811 West Resue Street in Boise, Idaho. And I am here as a representative of both Bloom and we presented to you all about 6, 7 months ago about who we are and what we do across the state. I'm also a board member of the Sage International networks of schools. So, pleasure to be here speaking with you and I've covered a lot when we spoke to you before, so I'll try and just hit on some key points that I've heard come up in subsequent hearings, attending and listening to those. So, charter schools are public schools that are part of the public school system designed to bring choice into that system. I feel choice is important. I have a graduate of Sage International, I have a graduate of Boise High. Both were served very well by the two different schools, traditional and charter. Charter schools are public, they're free, and they accept all students and serve all students. And Ms. Downey, who's speaking on behalf of SAGE, will provide you some data about how diverse the student population is there, just to give some comfort in that regard.

Charter schools conduct their enrollment by lottery. It gets a little confusing, but I'll try to explain it real quick. If there's less demand than seats, every person who put in the lottery in every grade gets it, regardless of that they got disabilities, anything of that nature you're in. If there's more applicants than seats in any given grade, there's a lottery. Students who already attend are automatically in. Staff children get a priority. Siblings of students will already get a priority. And then all students residing in the primary attendance zone get a priority. SAGE will draw their primary attendance zone to include all of Kuna. So, Kuna residents will get a priority only if there's still space after that, The fifth priority level is students outside that area to fill the school. I hope that helps make sense 'cause that question's come up quite a bit. The plan approach that we have, you know, as Bloom working in partnership with Sage for the Kuna school is similar to what we did in Middleton. We often take a phased approach with our schools where we, in this instance, we would build a facility capable of housing K-8. We'd likely open in 2028 with K-4, K-5 and grow over four or five years to fill that initial phase one space. Assuming that everything is going well

and there's demand in the community and interest for the school and a need, we would then fund and finance phase two construction, build a high school, become a K-12. We make that decision at that time based on desire in the community. So, we kind of build phased for a variety of reasons. We think it's good for kids in schools not to try to be a 500-student school all at once. It's exactly the approach we took in Middleton with our school campus there.

I think that school's in its seventh year, and this is the first year with the completed high school building. An important note I want to make is we build our facilities with no levies and no burden on the local taxpayers. We use our state funds, philanthropy, and private financing. So, you know, we typically for a -- we're building K-12 schools for 700 kids for a total of about 16 million. And none of that's local taxpayer money. We do it through those other resources and the benefit here of donated land through Mr. Eck So happy to stand for questions and we look forward with partnering with the community should you choose to move forward with this.

Mayor Stear Yes, Council Member Bruce.

Council President Bruce So, I appreciate it. I actually think the fact that the taxpayers aren't having to build the schools are a great option. But are you -- I know that there will be some impacts on public schools, whether you can't house some or maybe special needs kids or sports. Do you track any of that data at all? 'Cause I get a lot of concerns from our constituents to say, hey, yeah, it's great you're building that, but it is gonna impact the school some, the public schools. Do we know what that impact is, or is that something that you track or you even can identify?

Keith Donahue Yeah, Mr. Mayor and Council Member Bruce. It is something we track and more clarity probably on the SPED and special education end of things than exactly how sports works because that varies a bit, but I can answer both. And Ms. Downey will have some data showing that. So, when we as Bloom through the Albertson Foundation support schools, we require busing and free and reduced lunch program from day one. That helps enable all families to attend. We also put as a goal in every grant application that we consider that the school has to be attempting to meet or exceed the low income and special ed population of the district they're located in. And they have to have a plan for how they're going to do that. And Ms. Donnie will share that the Middleton campus for Sage, in fact, exceeds the Middleton district in both of those metrics. I believe the Gem Prep School that was approved recently also to Meridian South exceeds the Meridian. So that's a goal we watch and focus and make sure the school staff to achieve. Charter schools are subject to the exact same equal access laws as traditional districts. We're subject to all those laws. Parents can bring an action if we exclude or do not provide all of the rights you know and access they're entitled to. I hope that provides clarity on that.

Council President Bruce I just know that this is a new, especially for our district, having someone that has the forethought to bring their own schools in. And I just *wanna* make sure that we understand all the impacts or the moving parts that we're seeing moving forward, 'cause it is a great idea. I think it does help with the community, but I just *wanna* make sure that we're not having an adverse impact on one agency rather than the other. So, thank you.

Keith Donahue So yeah, no, it's a great question. Just to follow up on that, we received the same federal funding to support those students as well and Medicaid reimbursement and those type of things. So, it's essentially the same approach.

Council President Bruce Okay. Thank you.

Keith Donahue So and then on the sports side, charter, we have our schools attempt to offer the sports they can afford to offer. We don't build schools with football stadiums or schools this size necessarily to support a program like that. If the charter school offers a sport, the students at that school, you know, play that sport at that school. If a charter school does not offer a sport that is offered in the district, that child has the ability to, you know, if it's a competitive sport, try to compete and get on the school that would be their traditional home district school, and then they would pay the fees that a participant pays. So and we do have oftentimes and I'll speak with Sage. That's what I

know best. Typically, if a kid's a big football kid, they'll transfer into the school with their teammates. Okay, but oftentimes some kids will stay at the charter, and you know we try to give them electives at the end of the day, so they can get over to practice on time and participate. And again, these are kids from the community. So that's how that works. Does that answer the question?

Council President Bruce Yes, sir. Thank you.

Keith Donahue Okay.

Mayor Stear All right. Thank you, sir.

Keith Donahue Thank you very much.

Mayor Stear Emily Downey.

Emily Downey Yes, hi, thank you. I'm Emily Downey, 6060 South Sturgeon Way in Boise, Idaho. That was South Boise, pretty close to Kuna. Go to the dentist here in Kuna, love it. I am -- thank you so much, Mr. Mayor and the Council, for allowing me to speak. I'm the executive director of the Sage International Charter Schools. I'd like to speak on support of the Madrone development and just start with a thank you to Mr. Eck for the planned donation for a Sage School and a park that's going to benefit the community. It's a very high-performing school, as I'll talk to a little bit, and it's just a huge benefit to the Kuna community to add that. Sage schools are international baccalaureate schools. And what that means is it's simply a framework for rigorous college preparatory schools that are designed to develop inquiring, knowledgeable, caring young people with critical thinking skills.

Our schools offer after school, during breaks, and summer enrichment programming to help take care of those kids, and some athletics, and a robust outdoor education program. We offer student busing, which is really important in terms of a benefit for our kids and families and also for traffic implications. And we offer a full nutrition program that provides free and reduced meals for qualifying students so that we're making sure we're open to everybody. We always exceed our financial metrics while providing transparency and prioritizing our budget that goes straight into the student as much as we can. We feel very honored. My husband and I have three boys that graduated from the Sage Boise campus. All three of them graduated with a full year of college credits, hefty scholarships, all free rides, one to Texas A&M, and then my twins to Montana State. All three of them are graduated from college and thriving in highly sought-after careers as engineers. So clearly, we are sold, we reaped the benefit of that, and I think it's important to really understand what happens to a community by placing a sage school in that community. We are able to reach all sorts of students with different needs through our randomly drawn public lottery and get meaningful measures of growth and outcomes for those students.

A good example of that, and this speaks to one of your questions, is our Middleton campus. We have significantly higher special education, Hispanic, and low-income students, and military families. All of those from compared to the Middleton district around us, yet we consistently exceed student growth for all of the academic measures. Our Boise campus has similar demographics to the Boise School District. Again, there, we are consistently outperforming in growth and in all of those proficiency metrics. And, you know, Boise School District is one of the higher performing districts in the state. Sage schools are also. Our Middleton campus and our Boise campus are just examples of what a high-performing school can provide to our parents in the community. Our parents in surveys tell us that they feel we have high expectations for learning and that their child feels supported and cared for and that's a really important part of a school community to provide to the Kuna district. Sounds like I'm out of time I did have a tiny little letter that a Kuna parent wrote that I don't know if I am able to read to you. You want me to read that?

Mayor Stear Yeah, you can go ahead and wrap up.

Emily Downey Okay, thank you so much. So, she says it better than us. So, this is a Kuna, this is a Kuna resident who has a child or children in our Boise district. 'Hello, my name is, and this is to you. Hello, my name is Jackie

Gogan and I live at 609 South Red Oak Avenue, Kuna, Idaho. We have been a part of the Kuna community for 30 years. I wanted to write in support of the Madrone development because I am so excited about the possibility of having a Sage International School in Kuna.

Our children currently attend Sage International's Boise School campus and it's been a wonderful school but a challenging drive back and forth to downtown Boise each day and this is about a 19-mile drive for her. Our children have thrived at SAGE and have blossomed. We believe that the educational choice that SAGE offers will complement the educational programming offered by the Kuna district, allowing Kuna families to choose a school model that best fits the needs of their particular family. We also appreciate that public charter schools like SAGE build their schools without needing local property tax levies, a significant saving to Kuna families. For these reasons, I am in favor of approving in the Madrone development. Thank you again for your time, and thank you for your service to the city of Kuna.' And I'd like to express also my thanks to you for your service, and I'm happy to take any questions.

Mayor Stear Okay, questions?

Council President Bruce No, sir. Thank you.

Mayor Stear All right, thank you very much.

Emily Downey Thank you so much.

Mayor Stear Scott Hedrick.

Scott Hedrick Scott Hedrick, 1154 North Orchard, Boise, Idaho. Good evening, Mayor and Council Members. I'm here this evening to speak in favor of Madrone Village for several reasons. I've attended several of these hearings over the past years, and common opposition has been school capacity. It's the first hearing I've attended where the applicant is resolving the school capacity issue by donating a site for a charter school that will provide capacity exceeding 270% of the students generated by Madrone Village. The applicant is also donating a public park to the Kuna Parks. Applicant has already donated a two-acre parcel to Kuna fire -- rural fire district where fire station number two is planned to be built and will be provide expedited fire and first responder time south of the tracks.

I'm a general contractor. In the past, I built Kuna High School and I built two elementary schools for Kuna and have remodeled both those elementary schools since then. I was awarded the contract as a general contractor to build Fire Station #2 in July. There's a number of major issues that have come up since that contract was awarded. The two-acre parcel donated by the applicant to the Kuna Rural Fire District is not an improved lot. It's an undeveloped parcel that needs to be developed. Like any other development, Kuna Code requires that the developer bring all Kuna utilities to and through their parcel. This would include sewer, water, and pressure irrigation. The nearest sewer connection is an existing manhole 880 feet away from Fire Station 2. Our project, when we bid the project, had the sewer, water, and pressure irrigation shown on the plans, and it will not work. Public Works will not accept what was on those plans. Therefore, it has to be modified. The nearest sewage connection is 880 feet away. It's between 22 and 26 feet deep in basalt or rock. It will require saw cutting. Unfortunately, rock saws do not cut this deep. It's going to require a 6- to 8-foot-deep trench that will have to be excavated. And then the rock saw would come in and saw cut for the sewer line. This possibly could destroy the entire width of Kuna Road and require a rebuild of Kuna Road. 12-inch pressure irrigation is 1,000 feet west and should be installed behind the right-of-way in an easement that would be granted in Madrone Village if approved. There's a 12-inch domestic water line in Kuna Road that is valved and stubbed to the south to extend in Madrone Avenue, reflected in the Madrone Village application. This is the water main connection that provides service to Fire Station #2 that installs in the right-of-way that exists only if Madrone Village is approved. None of these improvements required for Fire Station 2 development comply with Kuna's to and through requirements. These improvements that we are currently pricing,

we got new plans last week, would add a substantial amount of money for us to go 880 feet to connect to the 26-foot deep sewer.

In addition, there is an access issue. Station 2 design has emergency vehicle signalized access to Kuna Road that is for emergency vehicle use only. The primary access to Station 2 is depicted as a temporary access that does not meet the ACHD's spacing requirement for Madrone Avenue. ACHD might allow this as a temporary access that is to be built before phase one of Madrone Village, but if Madrone Village is denied, the temporary access becomes permanent and is not allowed by ACHD. It's imperative to understand that if approved tonight, phase one of Madrone Village will bring sewer, water, and pressure irrigation to the fire station site. It'll construct Madrone Avenue south of Kuna Road, providing the permanent access connection for Station 2. And that's why I'm in support of this project. I think it will solve a lot of things for the Kuna Fire District, too, and possibly money going back to the taxpayers where the developer would commit to these utilities. Any questions?

Mayor Stear Great, thank you. Questions for Mr. Hedrick?

Council Member Biggs I do, sir.

Mayor Stear Yes, Council Member Biggs.

Council Member Biggs So am I hearing right then? So, if this doesn't pass, the fire station is, I guess, its future hangs in the balance.

Scott Hedrick Well, we have a written contract to build this fire station and build it in about 180 working days once we actually get a building permit. Public Works will not, has not approved the current utility plan, therefore the Building Department has thus far not has not reviewed it to issue a building permit. So, we don't know when that's going to take place. So, I don't I wouldn't say that it's hanging in the balance. We have a contract to build the fire station. But to do this new utility plan from what we were given last week, roughly Thursday of last week, we have to now price this sewer going this distance, and the cost could be substantial. So I think if you've got a developer that's willing to bring it to the site within the time frame that we need, which the applicant has committed that if he's approved tonight, he would begin CD drawings on phase one tomorrow. And we need sewer, water, and pressure irrigation in six months. And I think if that's accomplished, that solves a lot of problems for everybody. And then we have money then would go back to the Kuna Fire District for utility work that we're not doing.

Council Member Biggs Okay, thank you.

Mayor Stear Okay, further questions?

Council President Bruce No, sir.

Mayor Stear Very good. Thank you, sir. Tim Jensen.

Tim Jensen, Kuna School District Tim Jensen with Kuna School District, 711 East Porter Street here in Kuna. Good to be back in front of you after a little hiatus and so. Kuna School District, I first want to say we're not in opposition to other schools and choice and stuff like that. This isn't a Kuna versus Sage issue. I think the applicant and they've already stated they understand there's going to be an impact on the public schools, you know, and to start out, you know, K-4 and I know very familiar with Sage's model, have friends that are teachers and administrators within their. Their system and but going through, you know, a K-4 eventually building out to a K-8 after, you know, until and if that high school is built, then those kids transition to a high school and most likely if it's close to here, it's either Kuna High School or Swan Falls High. And so, you know, if you and I know I watched your last meeting and I know Danielle talked to you about the population sizes of our schools, and Kuna High School's at 110% capacity right now, you know, and so we'd be feeding into something that's already 10% over capacity. And, but they, you know, that's the thing about this, is there's not a denial that we can't force the people that live in this development to go to the school that's built in that neighborhood. Probably many would choose to, it's be convenient, able to go

there. But there's also a lot of the parents, and I'll bring up the athletic side of it, there's, from my experience working in 1A size districts all the way up to now 6A size districts, athletics are a big thing. And so those kids that *wanna* play those sports that aren't, usually basketball, volleyball are kind of the primary ones that they start out with. Yeah, if they *wanna* play football, football's an extremely expensive sport, you guys seen that, you know, equipment and obviously coaches and personnel and maintenance that goes with the facilities and so there is a cost to that and we weren't able to come to an agreement, a mitigation agreement, and I know the developer says, well the mitigation is we're building a charter school that's helping to relieve your pressure and I completely get that, but it's not -- we are still gonna have an impact in the public schools. And so we did, it's been quite a while ago, we submitted a letter of non-support based on those different things, those obstacles, 'cause there will be an impact on the local public school district. And so I just *wanna* bring that forward with you guys and stand for any questions.

Mayor Stear Thank you, Tim. Questions for...

Council President Bruce I do.

Mayor Stear Mr. Jensen? Yes.

Council President Bruce Thank you, Mr. Jensen, nice to see you again. So I'll reiterate every, like I did with Danielle and before, the community has said we're not gonna pass a bond, and then developers don't *wanna* participate, but the schools are still growing. I've asked for a capacity plan, right? Because at some point it's gotta change, you can't just keep packing them in there, you've gotta say what does that look like, is it mobile units, is it buses, is it teachers? If you could please share that with whoever's on your building committee, that please provide that because if it, maybe you have folks who are coming in to develop and they'd say, well, I understand there's going to be more capacity. You need 6 trailers, you need buses, you need teachers. Maybe they're more apt to do that. to at least help ease the burden of the schools. And then that way we know as well, because it gets kind of confusing when sometimes you show up and you're like, 'oh, well, we'll partner or we won't or we're full or we won't.' And I know that puts you in a weird spot. I don't mean to put you on the spot, but we need something so that we can make the best decision while we're looking at these projects. So, thank you.

Tim Jensen, Kuna School District Yeah, no, and Councilman Bruce, like I said, I watched the last meeting and saw that you had made that same comment. And it's something I took note of. I've officially been on the clock back in this position for about 36 hours, so I tried to do some cramming on stuff. But...

Council President Bruce And I know it's not ideal to put, you know, try mobile units and things like that, but when you're full, you're full, you have to make it work. So, we just need to know what that looks like. So, thank you.

Mayor Stear Any further questions for Mr. Jensen? Yes, Council Member Biggs.

Council Member Biggs Just one real quick, Tim. This would feed into Indian Creek Elementary?

Tim Jensen, Kuna School District Yes.

Council Member Biggs And I guess Kuna Middle School?

Tim Jensen, Kuna School District Kuna Middle School, yeah.

Council Member Biggs What's the capacity on both of those right now?

Tim Jensen, Kuna School District Off the top of my head, I know Indian Creek is at 80, I'm going to say it's 87, but I don't quote me, because with the boundary changes, we just had like a lot of that just shifted.

Council Member Biggs They start at Indian Creek and they go to Ross, right?

Tim Jensen, Kuna School District Yeah, Indian Creek, Ross, then Kuna Middle from Ross, and so, yeah. And so Kitta Middle School right now, depending on the grade level you're looking at, they're at 90, I'm gonna say it was 91% capacity, if I recall, right? But like their sixth grade is over capacity. You know, And I'm the principal at Fremont Middle School, and we got an influx of kids this year, and we're 24 kids over capacity school wide. And so it's just, you know, it's the dynamics of, you know, people moving in. We don't know from year to year what, you know, what those impacts will be and so.

Council President Bruce And can I make one more request?

Mayor Stear Yes.

Council President Bruce So, the district was providing a letter or statistics of every development that was outstanding and what that looked like. Do you know why they stopped providing that to us or if they could, could you provide that again? It was -- It's been, what, a year?

Council Member Biggs Yeah. Yeah, the one with all the colors on it.

Council President Bruce Yeah, it shows, hey, these are the developments that are outstanding, here's what these capacities look like as we grow, so that way it's easier for us to visualize it.

Tim Jensen, Kuna School District Yeah, no, I can, absolutely, like I said...

Council President Bruce Thank you.

Tim Jensen, Kuna School District Getting back into the position—

Council President Bruce In the groove.

Tim Jensen, Kuna School District Help you out any way I can, so.

Mayor Stear Anything further? Mr. Jensen, thank you.

Multiple Council Members Thank you.

Mayor Stear All right, and that is all I had to sign up to testify. Is there anybody else who wishes to testify that didn't get a chance? All right, seeing none, rebuttal.

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering Thank you, Mayor, Members of Council. Do you want to go first, Tim?

Tim Eck Yeah, Tim Eck, I'm the applicant. I live at 6357 Buena Vista Lane, Star, Idaho. You know, there's several -- there's a bit of history on this, Planning & Zoning had one of the Planning & Zoning Commissioners...

City Clerk Nathan Stanley *Mr. Eck, can you speak into the mic for me, thank you.*

Tim Eck Had a had a real opposition to a caveat that we wanted to offer and that was that during school hours access to the park would be restricted for the school students. Park & Rec was fine with that. The school was fine with that. I thought this was a great benefit as it would provide additional level of safety for the students that were using the park. The particular Planning & Zoning Commissioner just lost it on that idea, what about the mother of the three-year-old that wants to go to the park, and she can't 'cause it's during school hours? At the same time, in two years, that three-year-old could be going to that school and have a much, have a secured park to use for the next 18 years. We're open to whatever works best for the city. You know, so we'll let the park be open all the time. School's fine with that. Park & rec's fine with that or if the city feels like it would be safer for this carry no carry concern to have the park access limited to students during school hours, we can do that. It's not the only parks in Kuna that the two-year-old could go visit. Our connection to Kuna Road, our subdivision, will provide two additional fully improved fully turn lane acceleration lanes deceleration lanes center left turn lane connections to Kuna Road we

more than triple the access to Kuna Road at Ten mile. In addition when the school comes in they'll have to do their own traffic impact study and they'll be responsible for any additional traffic mitigation that comes up in that traffic impact study. I think the general idea is that with the addition of the mid-mile collectors that we'll be producing, the local roads that we'll be producing, the two full service connections to Kuna Road, we're going to reduce the traffic at Ten Mile and Kuna. We're not going to increase it. It's a mess there with the Falcon Charter School. Who wants to go that way? They're going to go around it when they can. Gem Prep in Gallica that was approved three weeks ago will be a K through 12 from the beginning. The two schools combined will provide a thousand seats for butts. *I think that was your phrase.* Provide over a thousand seats for butts, but will only be producing about 500 students or less. In the beginning, the Gem Prep school at Gallica Heights provides more capacity than the student generation from both subdivisions. So, the school at this location just helps with the school need throughout the entire community.

You know, when we started looking at this site, we knew the community needed a fire station. When we did Madrone across the street, that was the biggest thing. We need first responders out there. So, I worked with Kuna Fire, we struggled long and hard, we found a location, everybody loved it. It's a perfect location for the fire station. So we bought the land, partly so we can facilitate that need. Had not planned on donating the site before the plat was approved, but they needed it. They needed it to get the bond passed. Bond had failed repeatedly, partly because, well, we need a fire station, but we have no idea where. Now you know where. Now you have a site, it's free, build your fire station, but the utilities aren't my problem. My ballpark estimate of those improvements is about two million bucks. It's not covered in the bond, it's not covered in the budget, it's gonna be a major bust. We bring it to their door. We give them the permanent access, we give them all these utilities at their property boundary. I'm not sure where they're gonna get the other two million dollars to finish that station. If they have to comply with the – Kuna's Code that developers must bring all utilities to and through. If it was a Jackson's, they'd be bringing it all to and through. They'd be spending that two million bucks. Well, they wouldn't spend two million bucks because they're not public. But when you go to public work and you've got to have a public works bid, the numbers go up. We've all seen the picture of the that says contract and the that says change order. There's a hole there. We'll fill it. We'll take care of it. We'll start design immediately we will expedite an off-site plan that will bring all these utilities to the fire station Public Works this and the fire department knows this as well if you have any time.

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering I don't have much to add. Tim is super thorough as you probably are all aware. The conceptual phasing plan, just to kind of piggyback on what he was saying, was developed specifically to make sure that the fire station lot was within the first phase of development. So, if this project were to be approved, the first phase includes 66 residential lots, but it also includes 6 commercial lots, the fire station lot, the school lot, and the park lot. So, Tim wanted to front load all of the amenities he's proposing with this development. For the first phase so like he said if we were to just start designing tomorrow we would get something submitted and hopefully you know start construction maybe next spring or fall you know depending on review times and all that good stuff but like he said he'd bring the services brought to the fire station lot so that they would be able to develop their building with the money that they already have.

Tim Eck I know KM will fast-track the design workforce and I believe the city will fast-track the approval process to get the necessary improvements in for the fire station so that we can get started on it as quickly as possible.

Mayor Stear Okay. Further questions?

Council Member McPherson he answered mine.

Council Member Laraway No, sir.

Council President Bruce No, no, not at this time, no.

Mayor Stear All right, thank you very much.

Stephanie Hopkins, KM Engineering Thank you.

Council President Bruce I do have a question for Adam.

Mayor Stear Okay.

Council President Bruce Adam, in the Public Works memo, it talks about the 655 EDUs. You want to expand on that some?

Public Works Director Adam Wenger Council President Bruce, realistically, that's a big win. As we all know, Ten Mile is a burden. It's overloaded. This cannot work as is going to Ten Mile. This off-site changes those EDUs to go into Danskin, which then frees up that space in the basin, which allows for this and subsequent headroom for future developments or just breathing room in the Ten Mile basin. Does that answer or would you like something more specific?

Council President Bruce Yeah.

Council Member Laraway So just to clarify, this subdivision is not going to the lagoons?

Public Works Director Adam Wenger It ultimately will. Yes, sir.

Council Member Laraway Okay.

Council President Bruce Anybody else have any other questions?

Council Member McPherson Well, yes, sort of. The memorandum from you to me doesn't make sense because it talks about connection points at Kay and Limestone. I think you got this project and the one over off of Kay and Deer Flat mixed up a little bit. I'm not trying to throw you under the bus, but I didn't catch this when I read it the other day. But the connection points you're talking about, East Limestone and Olivine, that's over by the bus barn. So maybe we need a new paper from you, but I mean, I know what you're -- what it probably meant to say that it was going to 10 mile an out and you shifted EDUs on the north side of the tracks to make this possible.

Public Works Director Adam Wenger Council Member McPherson, that is correct. I believe those street names must be in there for another one of the 106 projects we have going on. I apologize for that.

Council Member McPherson 106, is that all you got going on?

Public Works Director Adam Wenger I'm sorry.

Council Member McPherson *Geez Louise*. Yeah, no big deal. I just, I started reading it again tonight and I was like, wait a minute, these roads are a mile and a half away, so.

Council President Bruce That's going to be pumping a lot of well stuff.

Council Member McPherson Going a long way around the block.

Council President Bruce Councilman Laraway, did you have any questions for anyone before I close evidence?

Council Member Laraway No, I'm sitting here looking at the traffic and I'm like, traffic is, every time we have a subdivision, traffic is a problem, but -- I don't want to say it's the problem. It seems to be the excuse of why we don't do something and ACHD is in control of that. They're the ones that have the little wizard's hats on that figure out all the traffic movement and traffic devices that move traffic. And I think the developer looks like he's going to be quite a bit of an update on some of the roads, I think traffic is always going to be an issue. And that's the only thing I see wrong with this is the traffic, so I can't let it be the issue.

Council President Bruce Did you have a question? We're still in evidence.

Council Member Laraway *What's that?*

Council President Bruce *We're still presenting evidence.*

Council Member Laraway *Okay. I thought that we've moved on.*

Council President Bruce Did you have any questions, Matt?

Mayor Stear Okay.

Council President Bruce I move we close evidence presentation and move to deliberation.

Council Member McPherson Second.

Mayor Stear Motion is made and seconded. Is there any further discussion on that motion? All those in favor say 'aye.'

All Council Members Aye.

Mayor Stear Any opposed? Motion carries.

Council President Bruce Now the floor is yours, Mr. Laraway.

Council Member Laraway Do you want me to repeat it?

Council Member McPherson Yeah, verbatim.

[Laughter]

Council Member Laraway Now I just, again, we're back to the traffic and the traffic is always, it's always a sticking point no matter if it's the surrounding neighborhoods that have a problem with the subdivision. I'm sure the subdivisions that were there before that had a problem with their traffic. We have to trust ACHD is going to make the right decision and we have to trust that the road improvements that the developers are required to improve are going to flow along at the same time as we start reaching the problem. But again, I don't know if it's going to be a problem because a lot of the traffic is going to be going north. I don't know if a lot of traffic is going to be going through town. Well, they can go out Black Cat and cut across Columbia. I don't know.

Council President Bruce Well, and I think that's, I love the idea of the schools and I -- but when it comes to traffic, anybody can say they can do a project if you push it out far enough, right? ACHD can say, hey, we'll do anything. It'll be 30 years. But what is the quality of life that everyone has around there sitting in traffic everywhere we go right? There is uh you know that impact to our community. If they're going to go north if you look at the developments that we have on Ten Mile and on Black Cat all those have been approved because they were already annexed so we were kind of handcuffed there uh on a lot of those because they were approved a long time ago. This

is an annexation this is somewhere where we have more control and we could say 'hey, we're going to pause it and see what happens with the other developments around it.' I know that they're helping with the fire station and I think that's one thing. Would the community around it want to trade off the fire station being built for the impact of traffic that they're going to deal with? I don't like the fact that we have, that it's one or the other, right? That's, I don't like being put in that position. I think.

City Clerk Nathan Stanley *Can we make sure we're speaking in the mics, especially when the train's going by? Thank you. It makes Garrett's job a little easier.*

Council President Bruce *It gives Garrett something to do.* So those are my concerns, right? The traffic on Black Cat, on Ten Mile, all the developments that are approved up that way. Also, I don't like the fact that we're stuck in this position to where if we don't approve it, the fire station on the south side of the tracks is either going to cost a lot more to the community or not going to be done. I don't know why that wasn't, you know, looked at prior to getting to the stage it was at. That's nothing that we can do. But this is an annexation, so this is what we have more control over. With 6- to 7000 homes that are already outstanding in the community. We've always talked about annexation, so those are just my thoughts.

Council Member McPherson And I see your point. I'm living on that side of the tracks now, which I never had up until a year ago, but. Times of the day, yeah, it's rough. And I get your point on that. This is where we control it at the annexation level and I don't know why the calculation for that connection was missed. I don't -- I think they anticipated it would probably be developed the same time the fire station started, You know...

Council President Bruce Coming together.

Council Member McPherson Yeah, and all that. So I think that was maybe just an oversight, whatever. To me, it's a trade off that, you know, it took, and Mayor Steer can attest to this, 25, 30 years to get a bond for a second station or more. I mean, it took that long to get that first station built from where we were downtown.

Council President Bruce Yeah.

Council Member McPherson So to me, the trade-offs were that and they've downsized. I mean, you've heard the testimony on what they wanted to bring forward and what they had planned for that. So, the fact that they scaled it way back and they're eating the two mil to get water and sewer to get a fire station for our citizens on that side of town.

Council President Bruce Yeah.

Council Member McPherson And I get the school issue too. I mean, Charter school is not going to eat all that subdivision up, and it's going to burden our other school. It's also going to pull from the other school, too, in essence. So, to me, there's a lot of trade-off for the good on this project where a lot, you're right, at the annexation level, we can say, eh.

Council President Bruce Yeah.

Council Member McPherson I mean, me personally, this one's a 100% go.

Mayor Stear Well, I think they did address the fire station had to be done early in order, it had to be annexed and donated before they could go for a bond. And that's why that came in way ahead of this development. But yeah, so it's, it is tied, although it was done separately.

Council Member McPherson Right.

Council Member Laraway And I also think that we're looking at, it's not only Ten mile the traffic is going to be using, but you have that overpass at Linder that's going to be in probably done before this is done I mean there's a lot

of avenues to go north I agree with what you're saying but I also look at that fire station going that's a public safety need it's a need it's not a hey how about this it is needed on that side of the tracks now I don't know the cost difference between the developer paying for that or the fire station paying for it. But it is a need. It's a safety need. That's just my two cents.

Council President Bruce I think he said \$2 million.

Council Member Biggs I wish that we didn't have to approve a subdivision to fill that need. You know, that's where I guess I have a problem. It feels like this is kind of being hung above You know, it's like, well, you know, and I know this is not what Mr. Eck means, but approve this or else kind of a thing. But also with the New York, I'm sorry, not New York, Ten Mile lift station, easing the burden off of the Ten mile lift station because of this also, because we're going to re-map those EDUs to other places so that the issues there can be mitigated. One thing about the south, anything that's on the south side, I also take great interest in because we have a lack, a severe lack of commercial on the south side. And this will do a little bit, didn't really get too much into what those, what is planned for that C-1 beyond the fire station, I guess. We definitely sorely need commercial on the south side to offset a lot of this residential growth. I do like the traffic plans that will mitigate traffic in that area, but overall, all of Kuna, whether you go east, north, or southeast, I guess, out to King, it's going to increase the traffic period. We all know it. So issues with that as well. The design, I think, looks good and the school is obviously a great thing. But I do have some questions, just like I guess the Planning & Zoning Commission did as well. So the schools will bear a brunt for a while. Kuna School District, there's already so many other subdivisions that you alluded to that aren't even -- that are still -- that might be getting shovel to dirt before this one does. That's only going to add to that 110% we're already seeing at KHS. So, and then the other, the feeder schools.

Council Member Laraway If you're looking at a scale of things, on the negative side, we've talked about traffic. But on the other side, we're talking about, we're getting a fire station, which is needed. We're getting a school, which is needed. We're getting commercial, which is a start. I mean, there's the scale tips, in a certain way for public safety.

Council Member Biggs I don't deny that benefit, but it just feels like we have to -- I wish we didn't have to approve a subdivision to get to that point to address that need.

Council President Bruce Well, I guess we could look at, we actually, we don't, but then where does it go from there, right? Then it's back to the taxpayer to foot that bill. Would they want that or would they want 3,000 extra trips a day, right? What's -- that's -- I see the public safety benefit, but I just look at annexations in general at some point, at some point where we're tapped out, you know, so, but I see the value of -- That's kind of all I have to say. I'll stand for a motion if any of you got one.

Mayor Stear That is all we had on the agenda tonight. I would like to bring attention to Ada County Highway District is requesting comment on their impact fees and they have a map that they're showing to divide that into two areas. It's pretty much a straight line running north to south. The one thing that I have issue with on that is it cuts, for all intents and purposes, it cuts our industrial zone out of our area of impact fee collections. So, that puts that money east of us instead of towards us. So, not sure exactly the implications of that. I'm going to have discussions with them and see if I can get some more information on that. But I am a little uncomfortable with that line cutting our area in half.

Council President Bruce Well, if you'd like more input on that, I'd like to participate too, because they tend to spend most of those dollars outside of our area already.

Council Member Biggs Is that something that can come together as a statement from the Council?

Mayor Stear We can certainly do that. I mostly wanted to bring it to your attention so that you, they have a comment period right now, so you can do that personally, and then we can get together with ACHD and have a discussion about that. But I don't fully -- I understand why they want to do that, and obviously a straight line is the easiest way to do that, but just cutting ours -- cutting our biggest impact area out of our area is, seems to be problematic to me.

Council President Bruce I'll agree with that.

Mayor Stear And did anybody else have anything? I'll tell you staff's been working hard. Michelle is coming into her own here. She has been out and walking the downtown, meeting business owners and getting out and learning some of the stuff we have and finding good opportunities for the city. So, kudos to Michelle and her efforts to move forward. And she's done that kind of, well, I heard she had Jessica working in her office with her, but I think she's kind of been doing that on her own. So, thank you for that effort and we appreciate that. Adam's done great things and gotten us a long way with public works, very pleased with that. Things are going really good there. We don't have any of the issues we used to have. He reported today that 100% of the hydrants have been either exercised or replaced, and so that's complete. We don't have to worry about fire hydrants being ineffective anymore...

Council President Bruce Over-weight.

Mayor Stear Adam if you want to talk about that.

Council President Bruce You exercised them.

Council Member Laraway *[Inaudible]* The fire department for.

Mayor Stear I don't know. Well we like fire hydrants yeah.

Public Works Director Adam Wenger One note on that mayor there are 18 old-style scissor hydrants that have not been addressed and will not be addressed because it do so would cause them to fail and we would have to replace them at the spot, so those will be replaced in this year and next year's budget. But aside from those 18, you are correct, 100% have been.

Mayor Stear What was the number of those total? It was a lot, more than I thought.

Council President Bruce And thank you, by the way, because that was...

Public Works Director Adam Wenger 1,667.

Council Members Wow.

Council President Bruce And that was, remember that was a fight for years, so thank you.

Mayor Stear Yes, and Nancy's always working through our policy manuals, trying to keep updated on those. We seem to always keep Marc busy with something, so we appreciate his efforts.

City Attorney Marc Bybee Can I give a little update?

Mayor Stear Yes, go ahead.

City Attorney Marc Bybee The IDEQ lawsuits officially wrapped up other than Adam has to comply with the judgment. But besides that, the penalty that we had to pay was paid. And now just we're progressing through the new judicial review matter. We did something last week called 'lodging the record.' That basically means we made it available to the parties so that they can review it and object to it. I'm just letting the Council know if there is an objection raised, which the type of objections tend to be something's missing that should have been in the record, which happens, but I don't think we missed anything, but it does happen, or there's errors in the transcript. Oddly, the

Council would be called on to decide those objections and take some kind of action on them. So, I'm just kind of let front loading you to let you know that if something comes in the next seven days, that it would be on your next agenda to deal with the objection.

Council President Bruce Okay.

City Attorney Marc Bybee So, I don't anticipate anything, but you never know. I've been in judicial reviews from the petitioner side where the objection was an absolute, or sorry, the record was an absolute mess. But your staff keeps a pretty good record here, so I don't think we should have an issue. And if we do, I hope it's just minor. But after that lodged record is settled, is the term, then we filed the settled record with the court, and that's when it kind of starts getting into the briefing schedule.

Council President Bruce Okay, thank you.

Council Member Laraway Thank you, Marc.

Council President Bruce Yeah, that was several years coming, too. Thank you.

Mayor Stear And then the Clerk's office, as always, they went through and put all that together. It looked to me almost about like a phone book when they got done. Garrett was going through that feverishly to look for mistakes. Did a great job with that. Nathan's got a great staff, and they're doing good things there.

City Attorney Marc Bybee If t's any consolation there's a recent Supreme Court case that Boise was the party on that had like a 600,000 page record.

Mayor Stear I don't think it was that big. No. But it started to look like, he asked me if I wanted to look at it and review his work, and I said, 'I think you're good.' And Doug and all of his folks are doing good things consistently moving forward. Doing good work, making changes where changes need. And Chief Fratusco, he's had some issues come up with injured folks and people that are off, and so they've been dealing with some short staff issues, but still getting the work done and doing our community policing as well as our calls for service. So, I'm really proud of our police officers. We've had some transfers out. That means we get some new folks in. They are always very pleased to be chosen to get to be part of the Kuna team. And I think all those, I think, well, a lot of that has to do with community and the fact that the community is supportive of our police and make them feel welcome here. But, Chief Fratusco has done a great job in making this a place that they want to be.

Council Member Laraway Did we get our motorcycle?

Mayor Stear We have not got a motorcycle yet. That's still coming. But we have both of those officers now are off for a little while. I think Tyson's coming back.

Police Chief Mike Fratusco Frank, Frank will be back.

Mayor Stear Oh, Frank, I'm sorry, yes.

Council President Bruce I have one thing as well. I spoke to the -- I received calls about motor vehicles and camping and all kinds of stuff out by Black's Creek and Kuna Mora. I did talk to the Sheriff and he said he had also received multiple complaints. So, he was sending somebody out there to check it out just so you guys know if you get questions from the community about it as well. So, he called, he texted me today and let me know that they were sending people out there.

Mayor Stear And we have some other issues that we're working through. Marc is helping out with some ordinance stuff through the Chief on e-bikes and camping and things like that. All those things that are coming up. So, yeah, keeping track of all that as best we can. But some of those are tough to deal with, especially like the e-bike thing. I

mean, we've got We got folks running things all over the place and it's, police have their hands tied a little bit on what that is that they can even do about it. So.

Council President Bruce If I see that new motorcycle chasing the E-bike down the street, I'm going to know it's been out of hand.

Council President Bruce Yeah, I reached out to BLM also just to find out what, obviously the government shut down. You don't get a lot of people that want to call you back right now.

Mayor Stear And Jared's out on a training. I didn't think he needed training. I thought he knew everything, but apparently there was something he needed to be caught up on. But him and his team have been doing strong work also. So very proud of all of our folks that work here at the city, doing a good job. Irrigation water was let out today, so they're working to get that all buttoned up for the winter and make it to where there's as little impact as possible when it comes to start it up again next spring. Anyway, that's all I have, and I appreciate you all very much, and thank you.

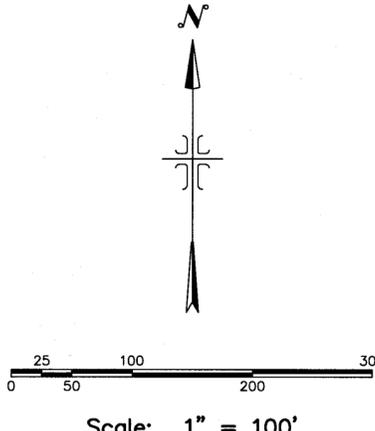
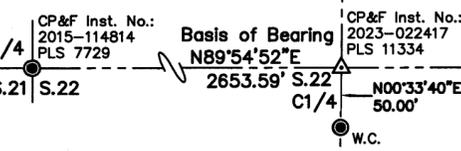
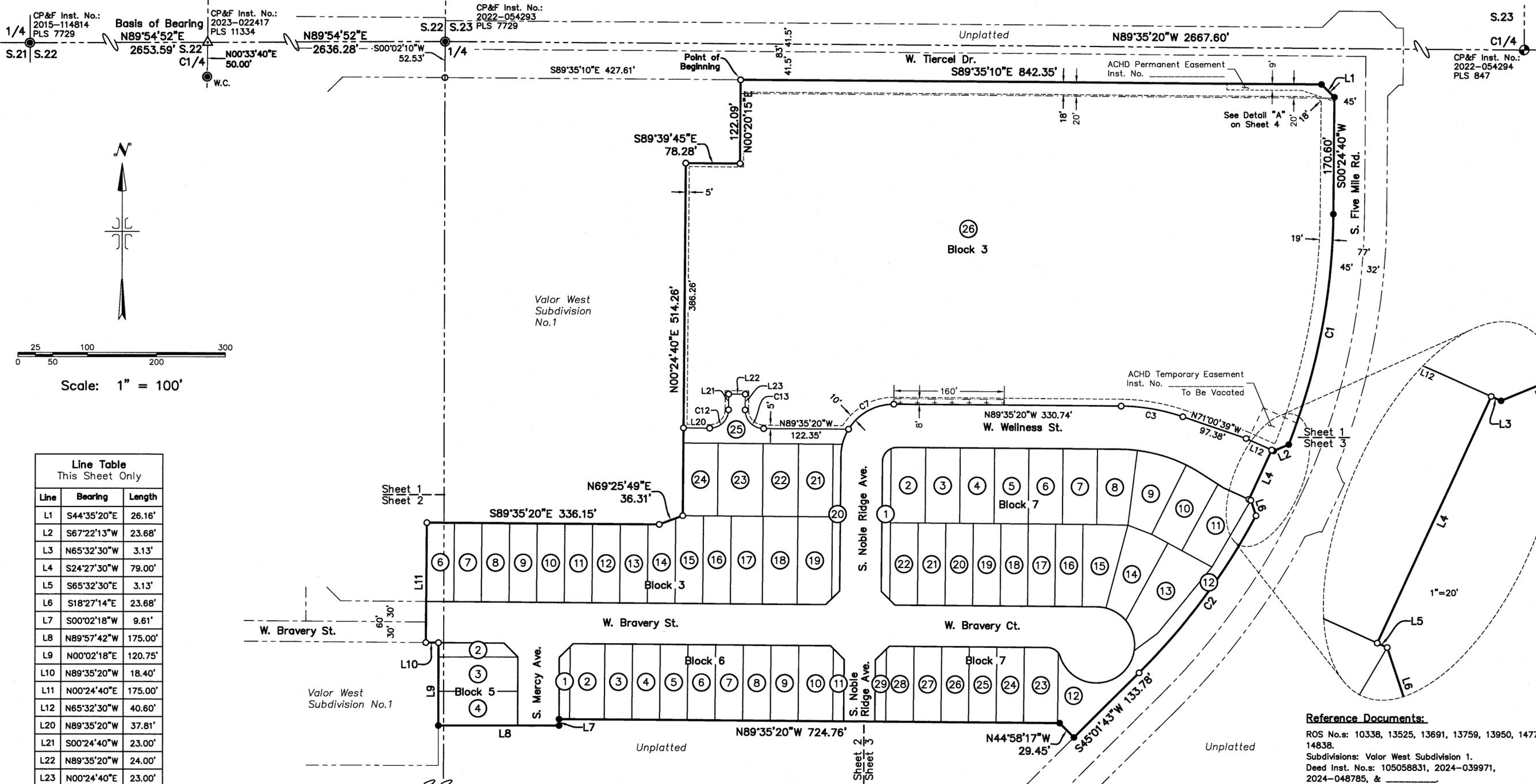
Vicinity Map

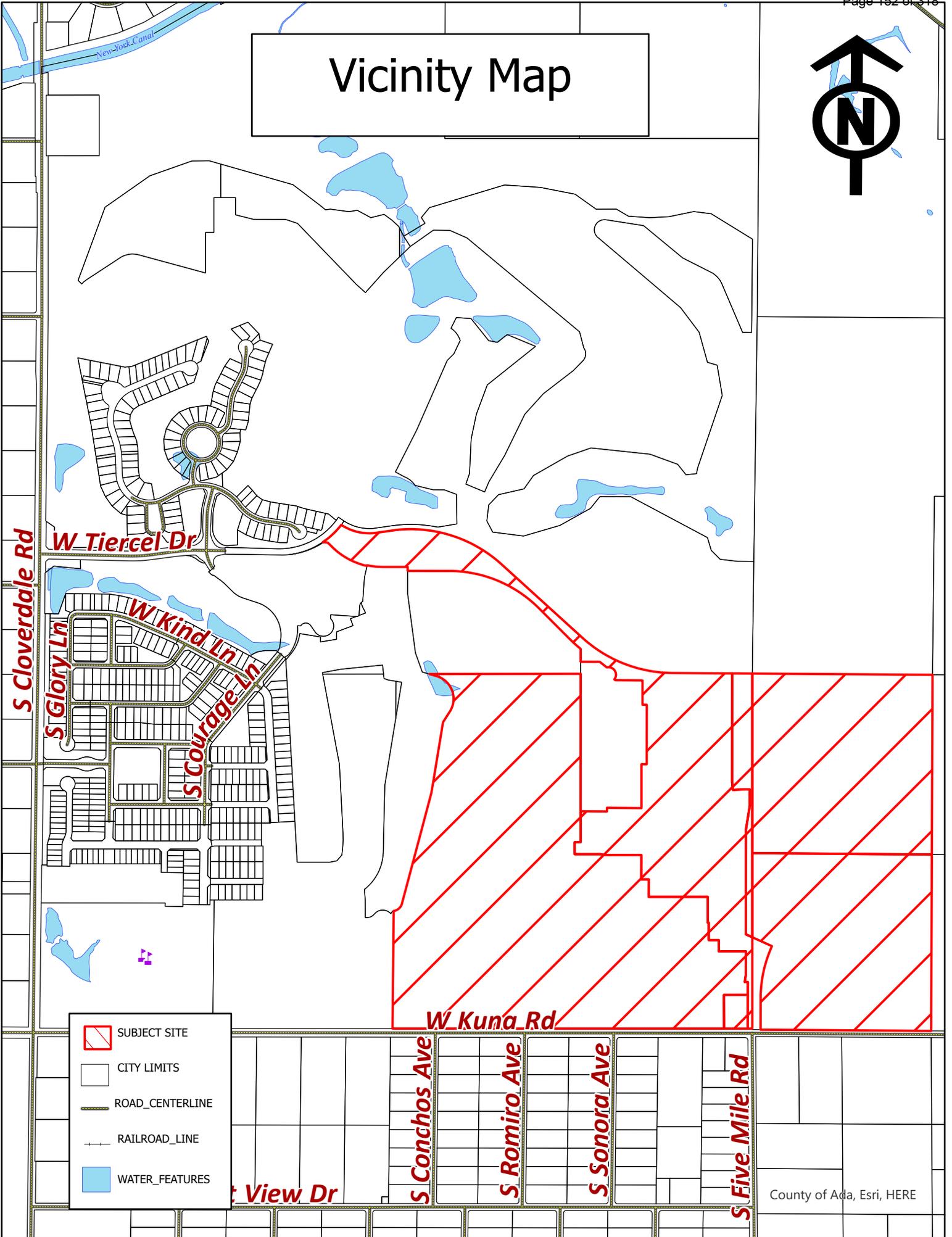
The Comprehensive Plan identifies the subject property as Medium Density Residential, the existing zone is a City of Kuna Zone; R-6 (Medium Density Residential). The proposed zoning and land use for the subject site agrees with the Future Land Use Map (FLUM) of the City of Kuna.

Recommended Conditions of Approval

1. Developer/Owner/Applicant shall work with Ada County Highway District and the City of Kuna to complete all required traffic improvements to provide public access to the site as this project will have internal private streets, as detailed in the Ada County Highway District staff report.
2. Developer/Owner/Applicant shall measure all front building setbacks from back of sidewalk on all internal local roads.
3. Applicant shall ensure the proper easement widths on all lots in accordance with KCC 5-9-308.
4. It is the responsibility of the Developer to ensure any anticipated buildings fit any given buildable lot.
5. Fencing within and around the site shall comply with KCC 5-5-5 (unless specifically approved otherwise and permitted).
6. All required landscaping shall be permanently maintained in a healthy condition. The property Owner shall remove and replace unhealthy or dead plant material within 3 days or as the planting season permits as required to meet the standards of these requirements. Maintenance and planting in public Rights-of-Way shall be with approval from ACHD.
7. Landscaping shall not be placed within ten (10) feet of any meter pits, pressurized irrigation valves and/or ACHD underground facilities and must honor all vision triangles.
8. All signage within/for the project shall comply with Kuna City Code and shall be approved through the applicable sign approval process listed in KCC 5-10.
9. If any revisions are made, the Applicant shall provide the Planning and Zoning Staff with a revised copy of the Preliminary Plat. Any revisions of the Plat are subject to Administrative Determination to rule if the revision is substantial.
10. Develop/Owner/Applicant is hereby notified this project is subject to Design Review inspections and fees. Required inspections (post construction), are to verify building and landscaping compliance prior to requesting signature on the final plat.
11. Installation of service facilities shall comply with the requirements of the public utility or irrigation district providing the services. All utilities shall be installed underground, see KCC 5-9-402-B-22.
12. Connection to City Services (Sewer and Water) is required. The Applicant shall conform to all corresponding City of Kuna Master Plans.
13. Developer/Owner/Applicant shall work with staff in order to provide final locations of streetlights as required by Kuna City Code. Streetlights for the site shall be LED lighting and must comply with Kuna City Code and established Dark Sky practices.

15. Developer/Owner/Applicant/Contractors are hereby notified of Kuna's working hours. Construction of any kind shall only be conducted within hours specified in KCC 10-6-3. Noises and other public nuisances/distractions outside of this time frame are subject to lawful penalties.

16. Developer/Owner/Applicant is hereby notified of Kuna's weed control policies and requirements KCC 8-1-3. 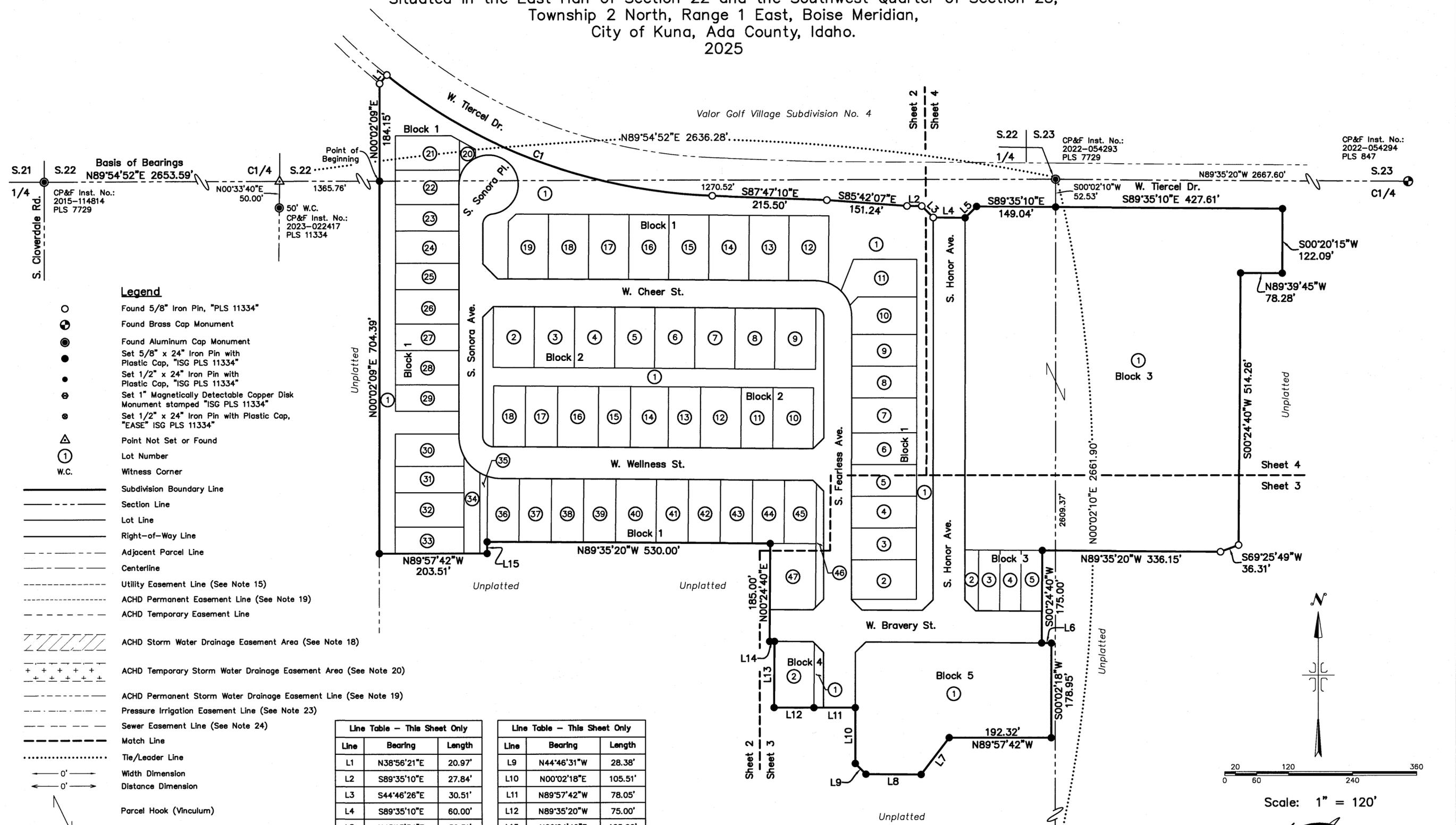
Vicinity Map

If the assessment is not paid by the HOA, the individual improved lots are subject to a lien for non-payment.
11. This development is subject to that Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions, which will be recorded concurrently with this plat; and any existing or future amendments, restatements, or supplements to said Declaration.
12. This subdivision will be subject to the Master CC&R's Instrument Numbers 2022-017810 & 2022-084168, and as may be amended from time to time.
13. This Development is subject to Development Agreement Instrument No. 2019-111089 and includes annexation into the City of Kuna.
14. City utility responsibility ends at the water meter pit and at the sewer connection to the sewer mainline respectively.

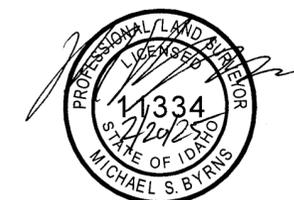

- **ESTABLISHING THE KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM POLICIES WHICH INCLUDE:**
- **ESTABLISHING THE KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM CONNECTION, SERVICE, AND IRRIGATION SUPPLY FEES POLICY; AND**
- **ESTABLISHING THE KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM UNIFORM IRRIGATION WATER SUPPLY ASSESSMENT METHOD POLICY; AND**
- **ESTABLISHING THE KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM CUSTOMER BILLING AND PAYMENT POLICY; AND**
- **ESTABLISHING THE KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM CUSTOMER SERVICE CHARGES POLICY; AND**
- **ESTABLISHING THE KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM LOT AND PARCEL WATER ALLOTMENT POLICY; AND**
- **ESTABLISHING THE KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM IRRIGATION WATER USE AND ENFORCEMENT POLICY; AND**
- **REPEALING PRIOR CITY AND/OR KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM RESOLUTIONS R68-2024; AND**
- **PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND**
- **PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KUNA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: AUTHORITY AND PURPOSE: The following set forth the authority and purposes of the City Council for the establishment of the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Fees and Policies as provided in this Resolution:

- 1.1** The City of Kuna, has established, pursuant to chapter 18 of title 50 Idaho Code, a Kuna Municipal Irrigation System and has established boundaries within the City within which the City will supply and deliver irrigation water; and
- 1.2** The City of Kuna, is authorized by Idaho Code Section 50-1801 to acquire by purchase, contract, eminent domain or otherwise to operate, maintain, construct, improve, enlarge and

extend an irrigation system which includes canals, ditches, conduits and rights of way for ditches, canals, and conduits for the use of the City in supplying irrigation water to and distributing the same throughout the City; and

- 1.3** The City of Kuna is authorized by Idaho Code Section 50-1802 to regulate, control and supervise the distribution of all water used by the city inhabitants for irrigation purposes; and
- 1.4** The City of Kuna is authorized by Idaho Code Section 50-1806 to defray the expense of conveying, controlling, distributing and apportioning of the system's irrigation water, and the city may assess and apportion the cost thereof against the several water user or landowners using the same, according to the length of time each user or landowner may use such water, and to collect such money and keep it in a separate fund to be known as the "Irrigation Fund" of the city for the purpose of paying such expense, including the assessment of irrigation district, canal or irrigation companies providing the irrigation water.
- 1.5** The Mayor and City Council are required by Idaho Code Section 50-1807 to *"... on or before the second Wednesday of February of each year, meet and make an estimate of the necessary funds for the expenses of maintaining, operating, improving, extending and enlarging said city irrigation system for the current fiscal year. Said estimate shall also include a reasonable sum not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the total estimate for anticipated unpaid and delinquent taxes and such sum as may be necessary to retire outstanding warrants, indebtedness, sinking funds, bonds and interest of a city irrigation system, and shall spread the same upon their minutes and shall thereupon apportion to each lot, piece or parcel of land within the boundaries of such irrigation system in proportion to the benefits received by such lot, piece or parcel of land growing out of the maintenance and operation of such irrigation system..."*

- 1.6** Section 7-8-5 of the Kuna City Code authorizes the City of Kuna, Idaho to charge connection fees set forth in a rate schedule adopted by the City Council as a condition for connection to the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System; and
- 1.7** The Kuna City Council’s intention and purpose for establishing these policies, is to assure that the City’s General Fund does not pay for any extension, enlargement, up keep, maintenance or assessments due to irrigation districts and or canal or irrigation companies in the administration of the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System; and
- 1.8** The City Council in order to exercise its authority and perform its responsibilities, in the administration of the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System, does hereby establish the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System fees, charges, assessments, billing, capital improvement fund, gravity flow to pressurized irrigation, water allotment, and use policies as herein provided.

SECTION 2: KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM FEES POLICY: The following are the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Fees Policy:

2.1. Connection Fees: Connection to the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System shall be determined as follows:

2.1.1 Irrigation Connection Fees Residential: Residential connection to the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System fees are as follows:

2.1.1.1 Irrigation Main Connection Fee: Each residential property to be connected to a System pressurized irrigation main shall be assessed a one-time connection fee for reimbursement of the capital cost of providing pressurized irrigation trunk mains to serve the property. The amount of said fee shall be a minimum one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four dollars and no cents (\$1,924.00) for each lot or parcel up to ten thousand (10,000) square feet in total area plus eight and nine tenths of a cent (\$0.089) per square foot for area exceeding ten thousand (10,000) square

feet.

2.1.1.2 Irrigation Pressurized Supply Connection Fee: Each residential property to be connected to a System pressurized irrigation pump station shall be assessed a one-time connection fee for reimbursement of the capital cost of providing pressurized irrigation pump stations to serve the property. The amount of said fee shall be a minimum one thousand one hundred and fifty dollars and no cents (\$1,150.00) for each lot or parcel up to ten thousand (10,000) square feet in total area plus twelve and nine tenths of a cent (\$0.129) per square foot for area exceeding ten thousand (10,000) square feet.

2.1.2 Irrigation Connection Fees Commercial: Commercial connection to the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System fees are as follows:

2.1.2.1 Irrigation Main Connection Fees: Each commercial property to be connected to a System pressurized irrigation main shall be assessed a one-time connection fee for reimbursement of the capital cost of providing pressurized irrigation trunk mains to serve the property. The amount of said fee shall be a minimum one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four dollars and no cents (\$1,924.00) for each lot or parcel up to seven thousand (7,000) square feet in total landscaped area plus eight and nine tenths of a cent (\$0.089) per square foot for landscaped area exceeding seven thousand (7,000) square feet.

2.1.2.2 Irrigation Pressurized Supply Connection Fee: Each commercial property to be connected to a System pressurized irrigation main shall be assessed a one-time connection fee for reimbursement of the capital cost of providing pressurized irrigation pump stations to serve the property. The amount of said fee shall be a minimum one thousand one hundred and fifty dollars and no cents (\$1,150.00) for each lot or parcel up to seven thousand (7,000) square feet in total landscaped area plus twelve and nine tenths of a cent (\$0.129) per square foot for landscaped area exceeding

seven thousand (7,000) square feet.

2.1.3 Irrigation Connection Fees Homeowners Associations: Homeowners connection to the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System fees are as follows:

2.1.3.1 Irrigation Main Connection Fee: Each Homeowners Association property to be connected to a System pressurized irrigation main shall be assessed a one-time connection fee for reimbursement of the capital cost of providing pressurized irrigation trunk mains to serve the property. The amount of said fee shall be a minimum one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four dollars and no cents (\$1,924.00) for each lot or parcel up to forty thousand (40,000) square feet in total area plus eight and nine tenths of a cent (\$0.089) per square foot for landscaped area exceeding forty thousand (40,000) square feet.

2.1.3.2 Irrigation Pressurized Supply Connection Fee: Each Homeowners Association property to be connected to a System pressurized irrigation main shall be assessed a one-time connection fee for reimbursement of the capital cost of providing pressurized irrigation pump stations to serve the property. The amount of said fee shall be a minimum one thousand one hundred and fifty dollars and no cents (\$1,150.00) for each lot or parcel up to forty thousand (40,000) square feet in total area plus twelve and nine tenths of a cent (\$0.129) per square foot for landscaped area exceeding forty thousand (40,000) square feet.

2.1.4 Previous Connections: In instances where an improvement on a property has previously been connected to the pressurized irrigation system and complied with the connection fee(s) in force at the time of connection, the above fees do not apply. If, however, the connection involves an increase in demand on the system, then the connection is subject to these fees for the amount of the increase only. In the instances where pressurized irrigation (PI) mains were installed by ACHD in the early '90's within the areas of N Franklin Ave, N Elm Ave, and N Marteeson Ave; those connection fees shall be waived with the approval of this Resolution moving forward;

homeowners would still be responsible for annual assessments for actual use.

2.1.5 Conversion to Pressure Irrigation: In instances where a parcel was annexed into the corporate limits of the City of Kuna prior to January 1, 1998, was not annexed and connected into the pressurized system of the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System, and subsequently desires to connect to the pressurized system, the applicable connection fees are 50% of the full amount chargeable per Sections 2.1.1 through 2.1.3 above. After January 1, 2024, the connection fees shall return to the full.

2.1.6 Connection Fee Financing Arrangements: Property owners desiring to connect to the City's Irrigation System under terms of Section 2.1.5 and Section 6 above are permitted to execute a note for the applicable connection fees up to the full amount for said fees amortized over twelve years at four percent (4%) interest and payable monthly on the utility bill. The Mayor is authorized to execute the note on behalf of the City and revenues (with interest collected) are to be credited to the same accounts to which the fees would have been credited if not amortized. Only connection fees are approved for amortization for the amount chargeable per Sections 2.1.1 through 2.1.3 above.

2.2 Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Service Lines and Connection Fees and Charges:

Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Service Line Connecting Fees and Charges are as follows:

2.2.1 Connection Services: Each irrigation service line provided at the expense of the City shall be assessed for completing services and connections in accordance with the following schedule:

2.2.2 Short Notice Line Location Charges: The City of Kuna, as required by law,

participates in the Dig Line system. Forty-Eight (48) hours notification is required prior to excavation by any party. Line locations without forty-eight (48) hours' notice will be billed to the requesting party at the rate fifty dollars and no cents (\$50.00) per request. There will be no charge for line locations during times of individual hazard or public emergency.

- 2.2.3 Re-connect Fee:** A re-connect fee of fifteen dollars and no cents (\$15.00), if performed during normal work hours or fifty dollars and no cents (\$50.00) if performed after normal work hours, which shall be paid prior to the account being reconnected, or as subsequently adopted by resolution of City Council, shall be charged to any account to reconnect service following disconnection for non-payment or for any other reason not in the discretion of the City of Kuna or its agents. This fee shall be applied separately for each request and must be paid before reconnection can occur.
- 2.2.4 Tampering Fee:** A tampering fee of one hundred dollars and no cents (\$100.00), or as subsequently adopted by resolution of City Council, shall be charged to any account reconnecting service without authorization following disconnection for non-payment of assessments. This fee shall be applied separately for each unauthorized reconnection and must be paid before reconnection can occur.
- 2.2.5 Unauthorized Connection Fee:** In the event a parcel connects to the pressurized irrigation system without authorization, meaning without having paid connection fees and receiving explicit approval to connect, it shall be presumed that the parcel owner has petitioned to connect, but without authorization. The City may collect a tampering fee as provided in Section 2.2.4 and disconnect the parcel from service, or collect full payment of connection fees and commence billing monthly assessment charges, or commence charging monthly amortization of the connection fees as provided in Section 2.1.6 and commence billing monthly assessment charges. In the event the parcel does not have a water right for use of the water, and one cannot be provided, the only option available is to collect a tampering fee and disconnect the parcel from service.

SECTION 3: KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM ASSESSMENT METHOD POLICIES: The following are the Assessment Method Policies for the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System:

3.1 Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Uniform Irrigation Water Supply Assessment Method and Payment Policy: The following is the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Uniform Irrigation Water Supply Assessment Method and Payment Policy which establishes a uniform method of the determination and allocation of assessments for the delivery of Kuna Municipal Irrigation System irrigation water, as follows:

3.1.1 Pressurized Irrigation Service Assessments: Each parcel or lot receiving pressurized irrigation service shall receive an annual assessment, consisting of the sum of three components, which are defined and computed as follows:

3.1.1.1 Assessment Expense: All accounts shall be assessed six dollars and no cents (\$6.00) per account to defray the cost of preparing, mailing and collecting the assessment.

3.1.1.2 Base Assessment: Each parcel or lot shall be assessed at the rate of sixty-two dollars and no cents (\$62.00) per acre, but with a minimum assessment per account of seventy dollars and no cents (\$70.00). This component of the total assessment is largely to defray the cost of water rental charged by the underlying irrigation district, with any amounts remaining to contribute to capital replacement and maintenance costs.

3.1.1.3 Operations Assessment: Any properties with pressure irrigation service shall be assessed annually seventy dollars and no cents (\$70.00) per account for a property up to ten thousand (10,000) square feet in total area. The added assessment for accounts larger than ten thousand (10,000) square feet shall be five dollars and no cents (\$5.00) per thousand (1,000) square feet for the portion of the property exceeding ten thousand (10,000)

square feet in area.

3.1.2 Gravity Irrigation Service Assessment: Each parcel or lot receiving gravity irrigation service from the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System shall receive an annual assessment, consisting of the sum of three components, which are defined and computed as follows:

3.1.2.1 Assessment Expense: All accounts shall be assessed six dollars and no cents (\$6.00) per account to defray the cost of preparing, mailing and collecting the assessment.

3.1.2.2 Base Assessment: Each parcel or lot shall be assessed at the rate of sixty dollars and no cents (\$60.00) per acre, but with a minimum assessment per account of twenty-seven dollars and no cents (\$27.00). This component of the total assessment is largely to defray the cost of water rental charged by the underlying irrigation district, with any amounts remaining to contribute to capital replacement and maintenance costs.

3.1.2.3 Operations Assessment: Any properties with gravity irrigation service shall be assessed at the rate of twenty-one dollars and no cents (\$21.00) per account for a property less than one acre in total area. The added assessment for residential accounts one acre and larger shall be five dollars and no cents (\$5.00) per acre for the portion of the property exceeding one acre in area.

3.1.3 Potable Water Irrigation (Special Cases) Assessments and Fees Policy: The following is the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Potable Water Irrigation (Special Cases) Assessments and Fees Policy: Properties which have constructed pressurized irrigation facilities, which are intended to be connected in the future to the City's pressurized irrigation system, but which have not yet completed the connection, and which currently receive their irrigation supply from the City's potable system, shall be billed as a potable water account and assessed a Kuna Municipal Irrigation System assessment expense and a base assessment but will not be assessed as an operations assessment. At such time as the connection to the pressurized irrigation system is

completed, the property shall be converted to an assessed irrigation account.

- 3.1.4 Partial Year Assessment:** For purposes of calculating partial year assessments, the irrigation season is presumed to be April 10th to October 10th. For initial connections made during the course of the irrigation season (such as properties newly annexed into the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System), the new connection shall pay the full Base Assessment, the full Assessment Expense and a prorated Operations Assessment based on the portion of the irrigation season remaining. Partial year assessments are due and payable at the time of building permit issuance, and in instances where a building permit is not being issued, at or before the time of connection.
- 3.1.5 Full Year Assessment:** Initial connections made before the commencement of the irrigation season (before April 10th) but after adoption of the annual assessment roll, shall be assessed the full annual irrigation assessment, prior to delivery of irrigation water, as if included in the annual assessment roll, less any vacant lot assessments that have been paid.
- 3.1.6 Dual Assessment:** In the event a parcel receives an assessment from the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System, and also receives and pays an assessment from the property's underlying irrigation district for the same irrigation season, the amount paid to the irrigation district the parcel is within, shall be credited to the account with the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System. This policy presumes the city does not receive an assessment from the underlying irrigation district for the same parcel.
- 3.1.7 Vacant Lot Assessment:** A non-irrigated parcel of one acre or less in area which has access to pressure irrigation and which is eligible for a building permit for either residential or commercial purposes, but which has not yet exercised that right at the time of assessment, shall be assessed thirty-two dollars and no cents (\$32.00) per buildable parcel. Vacant lots larger than one acre in size are assessed as a gravity irrigation lot. In the event a building permit is obtained on said parcel after the time of assessment, but before the end of the irrigation season, said parcel shall be treated as a "partial year" or "full year" assessment, as defined above, with credit given for the vacant lot assessment already paid.

3.1.8 Assessments Due: Assessments are due and payable on April 1st or the first business day thereafter.

3.2 Board of Correction: Be it further resolved that the Board of Correction to hear protests to aforesaid assessments, and as deemed appropriate, to correct the same, shall meet March 3, 2026, at 5:30 P.M. at the Kuna City Hall, 751 W. 4th Street, Kuna, Idaho, and continue as long thereafter as may be necessary to conduct the business of the Board. The Board of Correction shall receive protests as to issues of fact in setting assessments, shall correct assessments to conform to the facts and shall conclude the process by confirming the corrected assessment roll. A protestant unable to attend the meeting of the Board may submit a protest in writing any time up to 3:00 P.M. February 26, 2026.

SECTION 4: KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM CUSTOMER BILLING AND PAYMENT POLICY: The following is the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Customer Billing and Payment Policy:

4.1 Annual Billings: All irrigation accounts which do not also have a potable water account shall be billed annually, with courtesy reminders until paid, and be subject to shut-off of the irrigation service if payment is delinquent as provided in Idaho Code 50-1807.

4.2 Monthly Billings: Each residential or commercial property that is served by potable water that also has a Kuna Municipal Irrigation System account shall be billed for the annual irrigation assessment, as part of their municipal utilities billing statement, in equal monthly installments until paid in full, and be subject to shut-off of the potable water service in addition to other statutory remedies if the monthly payments are delinquent as provided in Kuna City Code.

4.3 Opt Out Provision: A Kuna Municipal Irrigation System irrigation account holder may opt out of the monthly billing program at their option, and choose to pay the annual irrigation assessment in a lump sum payment due as provided for in Title 50, Section 18, Idaho Code. The City shall cause a notice to be mailed out to all Kuna Municipal Irrigation

System/potable water account holders informing them of their option of opting out of the monthly billing program and providing the address to inform the city of the same.

- 4.4 Monthly Rates:** The monthly installments for payment of the 2026 annual irrigation assessment shall be nine (9) equal installments. After retirement of the 2025 annual irrigation assessment, the monthly installments shall end until re-started by the 2026 annual irrigation assessment resolution.
- 4.5 New Service Accounts:** Requests to subdivide an account into additional accounts or aggregate existing accounts under single ownership, into fewer accounts, may be made by application in person at Kuna City Hall between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. during normal workdays. Customers will be billed five dollars and no cents (\$5.00) for each account added or reduced, payable at the time of the request. Adjustments in assessments during irrigation season, to the benefit or to the expense of the resulting accounts, shall be treated as “Partial Year Assessments” and prorated from the date of the request. Adjustments to the expense of an account shall be payable at the date of request and adjustments to the credit of an account shall be processed as an account payable in conformance with city procedures.
- 4.6 Delinquencies:** All delinquent accounts shall be processed in accordance with the provisions of Idaho State Code.

SECTION 5: KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

FUND POLICY: The following is the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Capital Improvements Fund Policy:

- 5.1** All funds collected from connection fees (Irrigation Main, Pressurized Supply Connection fees) shall be deposited in the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Fund and may be used only for initial construction, reimbursements according to adopted policies or replacement of Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Facilities.

SECTION 6: KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION CONVERSION FROM GRAVITY FLOW TO PRESSURIZED IRRIGATION POLICY: It is hereby declared to be the policy of the City of Kuna that it is in the general public's interest to convert from gravity flow irrigation to pressure irrigation where pressure irrigation service is available which conversion is mandatory in the following circumstances:

- 6.1 The number of properties served by a delivery ditch, and using the same, falls below a number which can be efficiently served. It shall be presumed that every delivery ditch requires five miner's inches of lost carrying water to operate and that each property is entitled to one miner's inch of delivered water. A delivery ditch shall be considered "not efficient" if the carrying water equals or exceeds the delivered water.
- 6.2 The delivery ditch has a history of two or more instances of accidental flooding of nearby properties.
- 6.3 Drainage facilities are missing or inadequate to protect the gravity served properties.
- 6.4 In instances where mandatory conversion is ordered by the City, the fifty percent reduction in connection fees and amortization shall be applied as outlined in Sections 2.1.5 and 2.1.6 above.

SECTION 7: KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM LOT AND PARCEL WATER ALLOTMENT POLICY: The following is the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Lot and Parcel Water Allotment Policy:

- 7.1 **Lot and Parcel Allotment Limitation:** No lot or parcel is entitled to receive delivery of a quantity of irrigation water which exceeds the allotment of irrigation water provided for that parcel by the irrigation district within which the lot or parcel lies.

SECTION 8: KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM WATER USE AND ENFORCEMENT POLICY: The following is the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Water Use and Enforcement Policy:

8.1 Authorized Regulated and Prohibited Uses: It is hereby declared to be in the public's best interest that Kuna Municipal Irrigation System irrigation water be used efficiently for its intended irrigation purpose, and the following are the authorized regulated and prohibited Kuna Municipal Irrigation System irrigation water:

8.1.1 Alternate Day Sprinkling Policy: The following is the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Alternate Day Sprinkling Policy: Irrigation from the pressurized Kuna Municipal Irrigation System may be scheduled to occur on alternate days by order of the Kuna Municipal Public Works Director. If an order is instituted, homes with a street address ending with an odd number shall irrigate on odd numbered days and homes with a street address with an even number shall irrigate on even numbered days.

8.1.2 Wanton Wasting Prohibited Uses: Wanton wasting of irrigation water or use of irrigation water in a manner to cause damage or nuisance to adjoining properties is a prohibited and an unauthorized use which also includes the following:

8.1.2.1 Spraying, drainage or other application beyond the boundaries of the parcel to which the irrigation water is delivered; and

8.1.2.2 Use beyond the parcel's allotment; and

8.1.2.3 Use in violation of Alternate Day Sprinkling Order.

8.2 Enforcement: The City Public Works Department together with the City's Code Enforcement Officer are the City's designated officers to receive complaints, investigate prohibited unauthorized uses and enforce the prohibited unauthorized uses of the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Irrigation Water as follows:

8.2.1 First Offense Process: Upon completion of the investigation in the event the City Code Enforcement Officer finds that there is probable cause of prohibited unauthorized Kuna Municipal Irrigation System irrigation water use, the City Code Enforcement Officer shall issue and serve a cease-and-desist notice order by mail to the billing customer specifying the subject lot or parcel and the prohibited and authorized uses together with a notification of any repeated unauthorized use will subject the offending lot or parcel to be disconnected from the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System for the duration of the irrigation season.

8.2.2 Second Offense Notice Process: In the event the City Code Enforcement Officer finds that there is probable cause of an additional prohibited and unauthorized Kuna Municipal Irrigation System irrigation water use, after a cease-and-desist notice order has been mailed to the billing customer within the same irrigation season, the City Code Enforcement Officer shall issue and serve a Notice To Show Cause Hearing before the City Council as follows:

- Served by mail to the billing customer (at least ten (10) prior to the hearing date); and
- Includes identification of the subject lot or parcel and the prohibited and authorized uses and reference to the prior offense; and
- Includes a notification of specifying the date, time and location of the hearing before the City Council.

8.2.2.1 Notice to Show Cause Hearing Process: At the hearing before the City Council, the City Code Enforcement Officer shall present evidence of the authorized irrigation uses and the billing customer may appear and present evidence in their defense. If the City Council finds its more probable than not that the authorized uses as noticed have occurred, it shall issue a disconnect order to the Public Works Department to disconnect the offending lot or parcel from the pressure or gravity irrigation system for the duration of the irrigation season without any prorated reimbursement of assessment.

SECTION 9: REPEAL PRIOR RESOLUTIONS ESTABLISHING FEES, CHARGES AND POLICIES OF THE KUNA MUNICIPAL IRRIGATION SYSTEM:

9.1 This Resolution repeals and supersedes any prior City Council Resolutions which establish Kuna Municipal Irrigation System Policies as herein provided for.

SECTION 10: SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

10.1 The sections of this Resolution are severable. The invalidity of a section shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections.

SECTION 11: EFFECTIVE DATE

This resolution shall become effective October 21, 2025 following approval by the Kuna City Council.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF KUNA, IDAHO APPROVING A PERFORMANCE BOND BY HAYDEN HOMES IDAHO, LLC, AN OREGON LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY AUTHORIZED TO DO BUSINESS WITHIN THE STATE OF IDAHO, FOR BELLARO SPRINGS SUBDIVISION PHASE NO. 1 FOR UNCOMPLETED WORK FOR STREETLIGHTING PURSUANT TO THE TERMS OF THIS RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS BELLARO SPRINGS SUBDIVISION PHASE NO. 1 exists as part of an approved preliminary plat; and

WHEREAS construction plans for **BELLARO SPRINGS SUBDIVISION PHASE NO. 1** were approved by the Kuna City Engineer on **02/03/2025**; and

WHEREAS construction was commenced but not completed for Streetlighting, per the approved plans; and

WHEREAS the streetlighting has not been completed for **BELLARO SPRINGS SUBDIVISION PHASE NO. 1** according to the approved construction plans and developer seeks to bond for the unfinished work; and

WHEREAS the streetlight completion has been estimated at **FIFTY-SIX THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLAR AND ZERO CENTS (\$56,800.00)** adding 25% for a total of **SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS AND ZERO CENTS (\$71,000.00)**; and

WHEREAS developer desires to record the final plat for **BELLARO SPRINGS SUBDIVISION PHASE NO. 1** prior to completion of construction; and

WHEREAS Kuna City Code 5-9-403 allows for and sets the conditions for recording a final plat prior to the completion of construction:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Kuna, Idaho, that the Kuna City Engineer is hereby authorized to accept a cash bond in lieu of Streetlight construction for **BELLARO SPRINGS SUBDIVISION PHASE NO. 1** under the following terms and conditions:

1. All bid amounts submitted for unfinished construction are valid for the life of the Cash Bond;
2. The Cash Bond is irrevocable, is drawn upon an FDIC or FSLIC insured institution, is an institution with an office where presentment can be made within 50 miles of Kuna City Hall, the Cash Bond is claimable up to 30 days prior to expiry and expiry is not more than one year from the date of issuance;

3. The amount of the check is at least **SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS AND ZERO CENTS (\$71,000.00)**;
4. No more than fifty percent of available permits can be claimed during the life of the Cash Bond and if improvements are not completed within 120 days from the date that the final plat is recorded, no further building permits can be issued;

CITY OF KUNA STREETLIGHT IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT (CASH BOND)

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between HAYDEN HOMES LLC, (hereinafter "Developer"); whose address is 1020 N HICKORY AVE STE 100 MERIDIAN, ID 83642, and CITY OF KUNA, a municipal corporation of the State of Idaho, (hereinafter "City"); whose address is Post Office Box 13, Kuna, Idaho 83634.

WHEREAS, Developer desires to record its final plat for phase I of the development known as BELLARO SPRINGS_Subdivision, ("Development") located in the City of Kuna; and

WHEREAS, City will not sign the final plat unless Developer promises to install and warrant certain Improvements as herein provided and security is provided for that promise as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Installation of Improvements. Developer agrees to complete and pay the total costs of all Improvements required by City and those specified in the Approved Street Light Plan for BELLARO SPRINGS_SUBDIVISION 1 and the associated Bid for street lighting by ALLOWAY ELECTRIC CO INC.

The bids for said Improvements are attached hereto as **Exhibit--A**. The required Improvements are shown on the plans, drawings and specifications previously reviewed and approved by City in connection with the above described Development, and in accordance with the standards and specifications established by the City and adopted by the City Council.

2. Cash Deposit. Developer has executed and delivered to City cash, cashier's check or wired funds (City to provide financial institution information upon execution of agreement) to the City's trust account in the aggregate amount of seventy-one thousand dollars and zero cents (\$71,000.00), for deposit with City in its accounts (the "Cash Deposit"), which includes:
 - a. The initial City Engineer or Public Works Director's estimated cost of the remaining work shall as determined, in part, from the detailed bids provided by the sub-divider's contractors in an amount, plus twenty-five (25) percent, for an amount of one hundred twenty-five (125) percent;
 - b. To that total, the following additional sums may be added upon the following considerations:
 - i. Three (3) to ten (10) percent for inflation; ten (10) to fifteen (15) percent for

the City's bidding disadvantage; and twelve (12) percent to twenty (20) percent for city project management as determined by the City Engineer or Public Works Director.

3. The Developer and City stipulate the amount to be a reasonable estimate, pursuant to Kuna City Code.
4. If construction of all financially pledged improvements are not completed within one hundred twenty (120) days following the date of recordation of the final plat, no further building permits shall be issued by the City until final completion of all improvements has occurred and the City has inspected and approved them. However, if the remaining improvements are not completed within the one hundred twenty-day period, through no fault of the Developer, the City Engineer or Public Works Director may grant a one-time, one hundred twenty-day (120) time extension. The determination of what may be considered a "no fault circumstance" shall be determined by the City Engineer or Public Works Director.
5. Refund or Withdrawal. City may withdraw funds from Cash Deposit if (1) Improvements are not completed as required by this Agreement within the time period specified in Paragraph 6, or if (2) Improvements are not installed strictly in accordance with Paragraph 1 and written notice of the deficiency has been given to Developer, who has failed to remedy the deficiency within ten (10) days after the notice is sent. In said event, City may withdraw funds from Cash Deposit both (1) those amounts necessary to either complete Improvements as required herein or alter or repair Improvements to conform to the requirements hereof, and (2) City's cost of administration incurred in obtaining Cash Deposit, including attorney's fees and court costs, which shall be deducted from any Cash Deposit. If the amount of Cash Deposit is inadequate to pay the cost of the completion of Improvements according to City's standards or specifications for whatever reason, including previous reductions, Developer shall be responsible for the deficiency and no further building permits shall be issued in the subdivision or development until Improvements are completed or, with City Council approval, a new, satisfactory security has been executed and delivered to City or other satisfactory arrangements have been made to insure completion of the remaining improvements.
6. Preliminary Release. At the time herein provided, but no later than at the time of final inspection and acceptance of all Improvements by City, City will authorize release of all funds comprising Cash Deposit. The release provided for in this paragraph shall occur when City certifies that Improvements are complete, which shall be when Improvements have been installed as required and fully inspected and approved by City, and after as-built drawings have been supplied as required.
7. Non-Release of Developer's Obligations. It is understood and agreed between the parties that the establishment and availability to City of Cash Deposit as herein provided, and any withdrawals there from by City shall not constitute a waiver or estoppel against City and shall not release or relieve Developer from its obligation to install and fully pay for Improvements as required in Paragraph 1 above, and the right of City to withdraw from Cash Deposit shall not affect any rights and remedies of City against Developer for breach

of any covenant herein, including the covenants of Paragraph 1 of this Agreement. Further, Developer agrees that if City withdraws from Cash Deposit and performs or causes to be performed the installation or warranty work required of Developer hereunder, then any and all costs incurred by City in so doing which are not collected by City by withdrawing from Cash Deposit shall be paid by Developer, including administrative, engineering, legal, labor and materials and other procurement fees and costs.

8. Upon satisfaction of this Agreement, Developer shall provide the City with its financial institution information including account wire transfer information.
9. Binding Effect and Assignment. This Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the heirs, officers, agents, legal representatives, successors and assigns of the parties hereto. No party shall assign or transfer any rights under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other first obtained, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
10. Notices. Any notice required or desired to be given hereunder as shall be deemed sufficient if sent by certified mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the respective parties at the addresses shown in the preamble.
11. Severability. Should any portion of this Agreement for any reason be declared invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity of such portion shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining portions and the same shall be deemed in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid portions eliminated.
12. Governing Law. This Agreement and the performances hereunder shall be governed by the laws of the State of Idaho.
13. Counterparts. The fact that the parties hereto execute multiple but identical counterparts of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or efficacy of their execution, and such counterparts, taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument, and each counterpart shall be deemed an original.
14. Waiver. No waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of any other provision, regardless of any similarity that may exist between such provisions, nor shall a waiver in one instance operate as a waiver in any future event. No waiver shall be binding unless executed in writing by the waiving party.
15. Captions. The captions preceding the paragraphs of this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not affect the interpretation of any provision herein.
16. Entire Agreement. 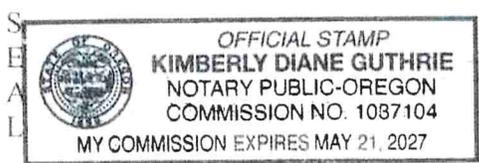

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between HAYDEN HOMES LLC, (hereinafter “Developer”); whose address is 1020 N HICKORY AVE STE 100 MERIDIAN, ID 83642, and CITY OF KUNA, a municipal corporation of the State of Idaho, (hereinafter “City”); whose address is Post Office Box 13, Kuna, Idaho 83634.

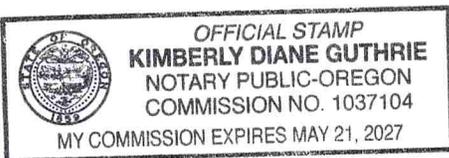

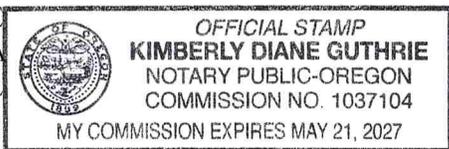

CITY OF KUNA FENCING IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT (CASH BOND)

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between HAYDEN HOMES LLC (hereinafter "Developer"); whose address is 1020 N HICKORY AVE, STE 100 MERIDIAN, ID 83642, and CITY OF KUNA, a municipal corporation of the State of Idaho, (hereinafter "City"); whose address is Post Office Box 13, Kuna, Idaho 83634.

WHEREAS, Developer desires to record its final plat for phase 1 of the development known as BELLARO SPRINGS Subdivision, ("Development") located in the City of Kuna; and

3. The Developer and City stipulate the amount to be a reasonable estimate, pursuant to Kuna City Code.
4. If construction of all financially pledged improvements are not completed within one hundred twenty (120) days following the date of recordation of the final plat, no further building permits shall be issued by the City until final completion of all improvements has occurred and the City has inspected and approved them. However, if the remaining improvements are not completed within the one hundred twenty-day period, through no fault of the Developer, the City Engineer or Public Works Director may grant a one-time, one hundred twenty-day (120) time extension. The determination of what may be considered a "no fault circumstance" shall be determined by the City Engineer or Public Works Director.
5. Refund or Withdrawal. City may withdraw funds from Cash Deposit if (1) Improvements are not completed as required by this Agreement within the time period specified in Paragraph 6, or if (2) Improvements are not installed strictly in accordance with Paragraph 1 and written notice of the deficiency has been given to Developer, who has failed to remedy the deficiency within ten (10) days after the notice is sent. In said event, City may withdraw funds from Cash Deposit both (1) those amounts necessary to either complete Improvements as required herein or alter or repair Improvements to conform to the requirements hereof, and (2) City's cost of administration incurred in obtaining Cash Deposit, including attorney's fees and court costs, which shall be deducted from any Cash Deposit. If the amount of Cash Deposit is inadequate to pay the cost of the completion of Improvements according to City's standards or specifications for whatever reason, including previous reductions, Developer shall be responsible for the deficiency and no further building permits shall be issued in the subdivision or development until Improvements are completed or, with City Council approval, a new, satisfactory security has been executed and delivered to City or other satisfactory arrangements have been made to insure completion of the remaining improvements.
6. Preliminary Release. At the time herein provided, but no later than at the time of final inspection and acceptance of all Improvements by City, City will authorize release of all funds comprising Cash Deposit. The release provided for in this paragraph shall occur when City certifies that Improvements are complete, which shall be when Improvements have been installed as required and fully inspected and approved by City, and after as-built drawings have been supplied as required.
7. Non-Release of Developer's Obligations. It is understood and agreed between the parties that the establishment and availability to City of Cash Deposit as herein provided, and any withdrawals there from by City shall not constitute a waiver or estoppel against City and shall not release or relieve Developer from its obligation to install and fully pay for Improvements as required in Paragraph 1 above, and the right of City to withdraw from Cash Deposit shall not affect any rights and remedies of City against Developer for breach

- of any covenant herein, including the covenants of Paragraph 1 of this Agreement. Further, Developer agrees that if City withdraws from Cash Deposit and performs or causes to be performed the installation or warranty work required of Developer hereunder, then any and all costs incurred by City in so doing which are not collected by City by withdrawing from Cash Deposit shall be paid by Developer, including administrative, engineering, legal, labor and materials and other procurement fees and costs.
8. Upon satisfaction of this Agreement, Developer shall provide the City with its financial institution information including account wire transfer information.
 9. Binding Effect and Assignment. This Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the heirs, officers, agents, legal representatives, successors and assigns of the parties hereto. No party shall assign or transfer any rights under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other first obtained, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
 10. Notices. Any notice required or desired to be given hereunder as shall be deemed sufficient if sent by certified mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the respective parties at the addresses shown in the preamble.
 11. Severability. Should any portion of this Agreement for any reason be declared invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity of such portion shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining portions and the same shall be deemed in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid portions eliminated.
 12. Governing Law. This Agreement and the performances hereunder shall be governed by the laws of the State of Idaho.
 13. Counterparts. The fact that the parties hereto execute multiple but identical counterparts of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or efficacy of their execution, and such counterparts, taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument, and each counterpart shall be deemed an original.
 14. Waiver. No waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of any other provision, regardless of any similarity that may exist between such provisions, nor shall a waiver in one instance operate as a waiver in any future event. No waiver shall be binding unless executed in writing by the waiving party.
 15. Captions. The captions preceding the paragraphs of this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not affect the interpretation of any provision herein.
 16. Entire Agreement. This Agreement, together with its exhibits and the approved plans and specifications referred to, contains the entire and integrated agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no prior or contemporaneous promises, representations, warranties, inducements, or understandings between the parties pertaining to the subject matter hereof which are not contained herein shall be of any force or effect.
 17. Default. In the event either party hereto defaults in any of the covenants or agreements

contained herein, the defaulting party shall pay all costs and expenses, including a reasonable attorney's fee, incurred by the other party in enforcing its rights hereunder whether incurred through litigation or otherwise.

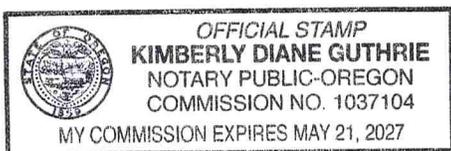

WHEREAS Kuna City Code 5-9-403 allows for and sets the conditions for recording a final plat prior to the completion of construction:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Kuna, Idaho, that the Kuna City Engineer is hereby authorized to accept a cash bond in lieu of Streetlight construction for **VALOR GOLF VILLAGES SUBDIVISION NO. 5** under the following terms and conditions:

1. All bid amounts submitted for unfinished construction are valid for the life of the Cash Bond;
2. The Cash Bond is irrevocable, is drawn upon an FDIC or FSLIC insured institution, is an institution with an office where presentment can be made within 50 miles of Kuna City Hall, the Cash Bond is claimable up to 30 days prior to expiry and expiry is not more than one year from the date of issuance;

3. The amount of the check is at least **THIRTY-SEVEN THOUSAND FOUR-HUNDRED SIXTY-TWO DOLLARS AND FIFTY CENTS (\$37,462.50)**;
4. No more than fifty percent of available permits can be claimed during the life of the Cash Bond and if improvements are not completed within 120 days from the date that the final plat is recorded, no further building permits can be issued;

CITY OF KUNA STREETLIGHT IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT (CASH BOND)

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between M3 ID VALOR GOLF VILLAS, LLC, (hereinafter "Developer"); whose address is 1673 W. Shoreline Dr. Suite 200 Boise, Idaho 83702, and CITY OF KUNA, a municipal corporation of the State of Idaho, (hereinafter "City"); whose address is Post Office Box 13, Kuna, Idaho 83634.

WHEREAS, Developer desires to record its final plat for phase 5 of the development known as Valor Golf Village Subdivision No. 5, ("Development") located in the City of Kuna; and

WHEREAS, City will not sign the final plat unless Developer promises to install and warrant certain Improvements as herein provided and security is provided for that promise as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Installation of Improvements. Developer agrees to complete and pay the total costs of all Improvements required by City and those specified in the Approved Street Light Plan for Valor Golf Village Subdivision No 5 and the associated Bid for street lighting by Street Lights LLC.

The bids for said Improvements are attached hereto as **Exhibit A**. The required Improvements are shown on the plans, drawings and specifications previously reviewed and approved by City in connection with the above described Development, and in accordance with the standards and specifications established by the City and adopted by the City Council.

2. Cash Deposit. Developer has executed and delivered to City cash, cashier's check or wired funds (City to provide financial institution information upon execution of agreement) to the City's trust account in the aggregate amount of thirty-seven thousand, four hundred sixty-two dollars and fifty cents (\$37,462.50), for deposit with City in its accounts (the "Cash Deposit"), which includes:
 - a. The initial City Engineer or Public Works Director's estimated cost of the remaining work shall as determined, in part, from the detailed bids provided by the sub-divider's contractors in an amount, plus twenty-five (25) percent, for an amount of one hundred twenty-five (125) percent;
 - b. To that total, the following additional sums may be added upon the following considerations:
 - i. Three (3) to ten (10) percent for inflation; ten (10) to fifteen (15) percent for

the City's bidding disadvantage; and twelve (12) percent to twenty (20) percent for city project management as determined by the City Engineer or Public Works Director.

3. The Developer and City stipulate the amount to be a reasonable estimate, pursuant to Kuna City Code.
4. If construction of all financially pledged improvements are not completed within one hundred twenty (120) days following the date of recordation of the final plat, no further building permits shall be issued by the City until final completion of all improvements has occurred and the City has inspected and approved them. However, if the remaining improvements are not completed within the one hundred twenty-day period, through no fault of the Developer, the City Engineer or Public Works Director may grant a one-time, one hundred twenty-day (120) time extension. The determination of what may be considered a "no fault circumstance" shall be determined by the City Engineer or Public Works Director.
5. Refund or Withdrawal. City may withdraw funds from Cash Deposit if (1) Improvements are not completed as required by this Agreement within the time period specified in Paragraph 6, or if (2) Improvements are not installed strictly in accordance with Paragraph 1 and written notice of the deficiency has been given to Developer, who has failed to remedy the deficiency within ten (10) days after the notice is sent. In said event, City may withdraw funds from Cash Deposit both (1) those amounts necessary to either complete Improvements as required herein or alter or repair Improvements to conform to the requirements hereof, and (2) City's cost of administration incurred in obtaining Cash Deposit, including attorney's fees and court costs, which shall be deducted from any Cash Deposit. If the amount of Cash Deposit is inadequate to pay the cost of the completion of Improvements according to City's standards or specifications for whatever reason, including previous reductions, Developer shall be responsible for the deficiency and no further building permits shall be issued in the subdivision or development until Improvements are completed or, with City Council approval, a new, satisfactory security has been executed and delivered to City or other satisfactory arrangements have been made to insure completion of the remaining improvements.
6. Preliminary Release. At the time herein provided, but no later than at the time of final inspection and acceptance of all Improvements by City, City will authorize release of all funds comprising Cash Deposit. The release provided for in this paragraph shall occur when City certifies that Improvements are complete, which shall be when Improvements have been installed as required and fully inspected and approved by City, and after as-built drawings have been supplied as required.
7. Non-Release of Developer's Obligations. It is understood and agreed between the parties that the establishment and availability to City of Cash Deposit as herein provided, and any withdrawals there from by City shall not constitute a waiver or estoppel against City and shall not release or relieve Developer from its obligation to install and fully pay for Improvements as required in Paragraph 1 above, and the right of City to withdraw from Cash Deposit shall not affect any rights and remedies of City against Developer for breach

of any covenant herein, including the covenants of Paragraph 1 of this Agreement. Further, Developer agrees that if City withdraws from Cash Deposit and performs or causes to be performed the installation or warranty work required of Developer hereunder, then any and all costs incurred by City in so doing which are not collected by City by withdrawing from Cash Deposit shall be paid by Developer, including administrative, engineering, legal, labor and materials and other procurement fees and costs.

8. Upon satisfaction of this Agreement, Developer shall provide the City with its financial institution information including account wire transfer information.
9. Binding Effect and Assignment. This Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the heirs, officers, agents, legal representatives, successors and assigns of the parties hereto. No party shall assign or transfer any rights under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other first obtained, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
10. Notices. Any notice required or desired to be given hereunder as shall be deemed sufficient if sent by certified mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the respective parties at the addresses shown in the preamble.
11. Severability. Should any portion of this Agreement for any reason be declared invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity of such portion shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining portions and the same shall be deemed in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid portions eliminated.
12. Governing Law. This Agreement and the performances hereunder shall be governed by the laws of the State of Idaho.
13. Counterparts. The fact that the parties hereto execute multiple but identical counterparts of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or efficacy of their execution, and such counterparts, taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument, and each counterpart shall be deemed an original.
14. Waiver. No waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of any other provision, regardless of any similarity that may exist between such provisions, nor shall a waiver in one instance operate as a waiver in any future event. No waiver shall be binding unless executed in writing by the waiving party.
15. Captions. The captions preceding the paragraphs of this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not affect the interpretation of any provision herein.
16. Entire Agreement. This Agreement, together with its exhibits and the approved plans and specifications referred to, contains the entire and integrated agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no prior or contemporaneous promises, representations, warranties, inducements, or understandings between the parties pertaining to the subject matter hereof which are not contained herein shall be of any force or effect.
17. Default. In the event either party hereto defaults in any of the covenants or agreements

contained herein, the defaulting party shall pay all costs and expenses, including a reasonable attorney's fee, incurred by the other party in enforcing its rights hereunder whether incurred through litigation or otherwise.

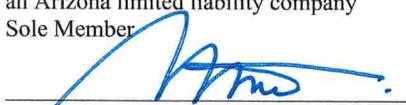

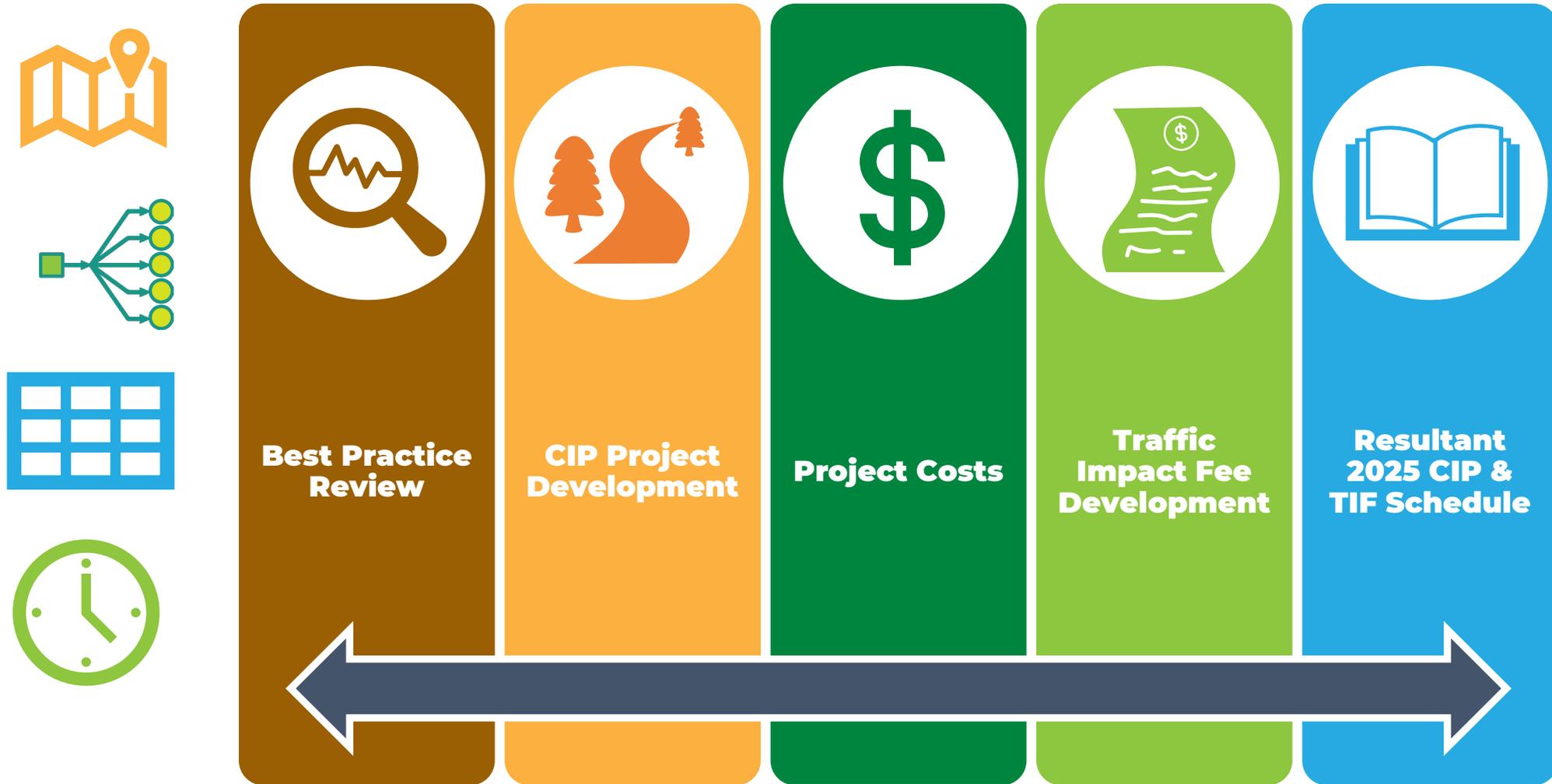

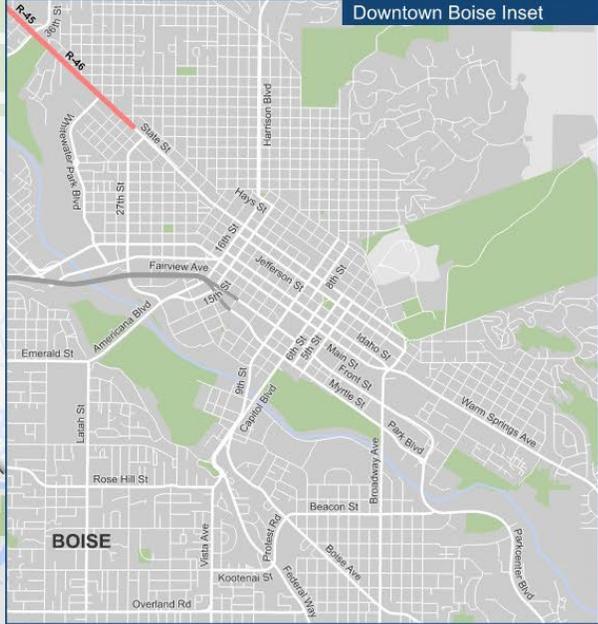

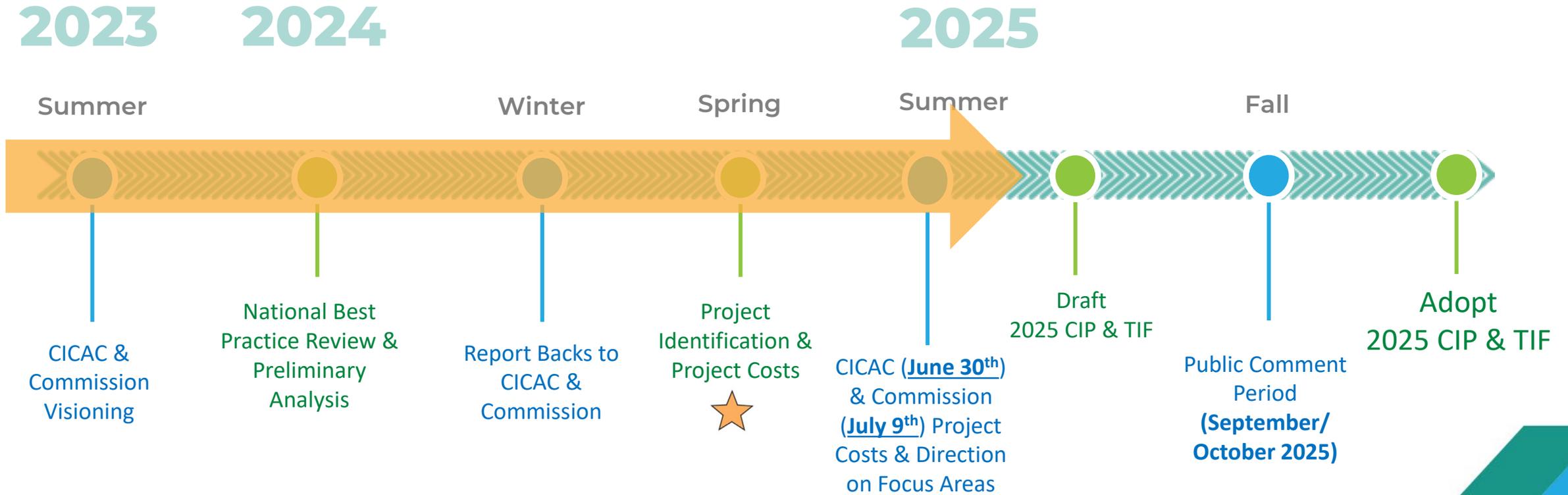

5-4-3: APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS, REVIEW AND FEES:

- A. *Application requirements:* All persons making an application for annexation, zoning, subdivision approval or any permit or other matter governed by this title are required to submit an application to the Director ~~an application on forms provided by the Planning and Zoning Department~~ on forms approved by the City Council and provided by the Planning and Zoning Department.
- B. *Pre-application meeting:* As determined by Kuna City Code § 5-4-4 (the "Decision Making Authority and Process Table") a pre-application meeting with the Planning and Zoning Department and other affected agencies is required, no more than three (3) months prior to submitting an application. The pre-application meeting requirement may be waived by the Director on a case-by-case basis.
- C. *Fees:* The Council shall, by resolution, establish fees for all applications or petitions authorized by this title.
- D. *Application completeness and compliance review:* Applications are not accepted until the Director Or The Director's designee finds that the application is complete and complies with this title. Application completeness and compliance review fees are required to paid prior to application being reviewed by the Director. The Director shall have sixty (60) days to review to determine and notify in writing the applicant whether or not the application is complete and in compliance.
- E. *Incomplete applications:* If the Director or their designee determine that an application is incomplete, they shall provide notice to the applicant of such deficiencies. In the event an applicant fails to provide the missing information within a period of fourteen (14) calendar days, the application shall be deemed to have expired, and will not be further processed by the City unless and until an entirely new application is submitted.
- F. *Acceptance of applications:* Applications, which are found by the Director to be complete and in compliance, are then officially accepted for processing. The Director will issue and deliver to the applicant a letter of Application acceptance. The date of acceptance determination shall be the date the Director issues an acceptance letter.

5-8-201: ZONING PERMITS:

- A. *Required:* No building or other structure shall be erected, moved, added to, structurally altered, nor shall any building, structure or land be established or changed in use without a permit therefor issued by the Director. Zoning permits shall be issued only in conformity with the provisions of this title.
- B. *Contents of application:* The applicant must file an application with the Director upon a form prescribed by the Council. The application for zoning permit shall be signed by the owner or applicant attesting to the truth and exactness of all information supplied on the application. Each application shall clearly state that the permit shall expire and may be revoked if work has not begun or is not substantially completed within one (1) year. At a minimum, the application shall contain the following information:
 - ~~1.—Name, address and phone number of the applicant.~~
 - ~~2.—Legal description of the property.~~

- ~~3.—Existing use.~~
 - ~~4.—Proposed use.~~
 - ~~5.—Zoning district.~~
 - ~~6.—Plan, drawn to scale, showing the actual dimensions and the shape of the lot to be built upon; the exact size and location of existing buildings on the lot, if any; and the location and dimensions of the proposed building(s) or alteration.~~
 - ~~7.—Building heights.~~
 - ~~8.—Number of off-street parking spaces or loading berths.~~
 - ~~9.—Number of dwelling units.~~
 - ~~10.—Proposed sewer and water facilities.~~
 - ~~11.—Such other matters as may be necessary to determine conformance with, and provide for, the enforcement of this title.~~
- C. *Approval of zoning permit:* Within thirty (30) days after the receipt of an application, the Director shall either approve or disapprove the application in conformance with the provisions of this title. All zoning permits shall, however, be conditional upon the commencement of work within one (1) year. One (1) copy of the plans shall be returned to the applicant by the Director after the Director shall have marked such copy either as approved or disapproved and attested to same by his signature on such copy. One (1) copy of plans, similarly marked, shall be retained by the Director. The Director shall issue a placard, to be posted in a conspicuous place on the property in question, attesting to the fact that the use or alteration is in conformance with the provisions of this title.
- D. *Expiration of zoning permit:* If the work described in any zoning permit has not commenced construction within one (1) year from the date of issuance thereof, said permit shall expire; said permit shall be revoked by the Director; and written notice thereof shall be given to the persons affected.

5-8-304: CONTENTS OF APPLICATION:

- A. Applications for amendments to the official zoning diagram adopted as part of this title must be filed on an application with the Director upon a form prescribed by the Council, shall contain at least the following information:
- ~~1.—Name, address and phone number of applicant.~~
 - ~~2.—Proposed amending ordinance, approved as to form by the Council.~~

A development agreement shall be in the form ~~required~~provided by the Director. ~~No agreement shall be accepted by the Director which does not include the following:~~

~~A. An affidavit by the owner (if the owner is someone other than the applicant) of the parcel agreeing to submit the parcel to a development agreement.~~

~~B. The specific use or uses of the parcel for which the development agreement is sought.~~

~~C. A concept plan of the project to be developed on the parcel. The concept plan shall include:~~

~~1. A description of the density allowed or sought.~~

~~2. Maximum height, size, and location of any structures on the property.~~

~~D. The time required to begin the use on the property.~~

~~E. A statement by the owner of the parcel that failure to comply with the commitments in the development agreement shall be deemed consent to rezone the parcel(s) to zoning designation that existed before the adopted of the development agreement, or, in the case of an initial zone at annexation, a zone deemed appropriate by the Council.~~

~~F. Any other matter mutually agreeable to the parties.~~

5-8-910: DESIGN REVIEW APPLICATION REQUIRED:

Prior to application for a permit to erect, construct, alter, move, remodel, or reface or otherwise change the use of the building or structure in the DR district, the applicant must file an application with the Director upon a form prescribed by the Council. ~~Applications shall be accompanied by appropriate architectural and site development plans as may be required by the Director. Such plans shall be legible, to scale and shall include, at a minimum:~~

~~A. Site plans showing:~~

~~1. Roofline and foundation plan of building, located on the site;~~

~~2. Location of existing trees and structures, if any;~~

~~3. Location and dimensions of streets and highway designations;~~

~~4. Location and dimensions of off-street parking and loading facilities;~~

~~5. Location and dimensions of points of entry and exit for vehicles and internal circulation patterns;~~

~~6. Location of walls and fences and indication of their height and material of construction;~~

~~7. Exterior lighting standards and devices including detailed cut sheets and photometric plan (pedestrian, vehicle, security, decoration);~~

Existing structures and sites: Applications involving conversion, remodeling, restoration, renovation, enlargement, or expansion of existing structures or sites shall contain information sufficient in content and detail so that the design review committee and/or zoning director may be assured the applicant complies with the provisions of this chapter.~~

5-9-203: PRELIMINARY PLAT:

A. *Application:* The subdivider shall file with the planning staff a completed ~~subdivision preliminary plat~~ application form provided by the Director and prescribed by the City Council. ~~to include all pertinent data required in this chapter or as may be required due to a complementary land use application.~~

B. *Combining preliminary and final plats:* The applicant may request that the subdivision application be processed as both a preliminary and final plat if all the following criteria are met:

1. The proposed subdivision does not exceed five (5) lots;

2. No major special development considerations are involved, such as development in a floodplain, hillside development or the like; and
3. All required information for both preliminary and final plat is complete and in an acceptable form.

C. *Content of preliminary plat:* The contents of the preliminary plat and related information shall be in such a form as required by the Director; however, the subdivider shall provide any additional maps or data deemed necessary by the Commission.

~~The subdivider shall provide the planning department the following information:~~

Any other scale requires prior authorization from city staff. North shall be oriented to the top or to the left on a landscape orientated plan.~~
- ~~3. A copy of the preliminary plat of the proposed subdivision on eleven-inch by seventeen-inch (11"x17") paper.~~
- ~~4. Specific information as requested pertaining to any special development areas, such as hillside, planned unit development, floodplain, cemetery, large scale development, hazardous and unique areas of development.~~

~~D. Requirement of preliminary plats:~~ The following shall be shown on the preliminary plat or shall be submitted separately:

- ~~1. The name of the proposed subdivision;~~
- ~~2. The names, addresses and telephone numbers of the subdivider, subdivider's representative, engineer of record or surveyor who prepared the plat;~~
- ~~3. The legal description of the subdivision prepared by a licensed engineer or land surveyor;~~
- ~~4. All preliminary plats must be sealed by a licensed engineer or land surveyor;~~
- ~~5. A general narrative about the proposed subdivision;~~
- ~~6. A map of the entire area scheduled for development to include any adjoining lands in the same ownership;~~
- ~~7. A vicinity map showing the relationship of the proposed plat to the surrounding area (one-half mile minimum radius, scale optional);~~

 - ~~c. Vicinity map showing the relationship of the proposed plat to the surrounding surface water features (one-half mile minimum radius) including, but not limited to, all irrigation ditches, drainages, etc.~~
 - ~~d. All off site improvements required to service the development.~~~~
- ~~14. Any dedications to the public and/or easements, together with a statement of location, dimensions and purpose of each;~~
- ~~15. A draft agreement between the developer and city specifying the duties and obligations of the developer and the city in maintaining stormwater retention areas;~~
- ~~16. Provide a common lot/open space table to include: Location, size in acres, uses and ownership of each common lot;~~
- ~~17. Provide hydro and soils reports that are no more than twelve (12) months old;~~
- ~~18. Provide a site data table on the cover sheet to include the following information:
 - ~~a. Total site acreage.~~
 - ~~b. Current zoning.~~
 - ~~c. Proposed zoning.~~
 - ~~d. Utility providers.~~
 - ~~e. Protection services.~~~~

~~f. School district.~~

~~g. Irrigation district.~~

~~h. Total lots.~~

~~19. Any additional required information for special developments as specified in Chapter 5 of this title.~~

DE. *Application procedures:* For application procedures, see Chapter 4 of this of this title.

EF. *Commission's findings:* In determining the acceptance of a proposed subdivision, the commission shall consider the objectives of this chapter to include the following:

1. The conformance of the subdivision with the comprehensive plan;
2. The availability of public services to accommodate the proposed development;
3. The continuity of the proposed development with the capital improvement program;
4. The public's capability to provide supporting services to the proposed development; and
5. Other health, safety and environmental considerations.

FG. *Action on preliminary plat:* The Commission may recommend approval, conditional approval, disapproval or table the preliminary plat for additional information. These noted alternatives shall be initiated within forty-five (45) days of the date of the regular meeting at which the plat is first considered by the Commission. The action and the reasons for such recommended action shall be stated in writing by the Commission, and forwarded to the applicant by the Director.

GH. *Administrative processing:* The Director shall also forward a statement of the action taken and the reasons for such action, together with a copy of the preliminary plat to the Council for their approval at the next regularly scheduled meeting. Upon the Council's granting or denying a preliminary plat, the Council shall specify:

1. The ordinance and standards used in evaluating the application;
2. The reasons for approval or denial; and
3. The actions, if any, that the applicant could take to obtain a permit.

HI. *Action on combined preliminary and final plat:* If the Commission's conclusion is favorable to the subdivider's request for the subdivision to be considered both as a preliminary and final plat, then a recommendation shall be forwarded to the Council in the same manner specified for a final plat. The Commission may recommend that the combined application be approved, approved conditionally, or disapproved.

IJ. *Approval period:*

1. A preliminary plat approval shall be valid for two (2) years from the date of approval of the final written decision by the Council, unless extended as provided for in KCC 5-9-205.

JK. *Fee schedule*: Fees associated with preliminary plats may be reviewed and updated by the Council from time to time.

5-9-204: FINAL PLAT:

The following procedures shall apply to the filing for final plat approval of any City of Kuna subdivision:

- A. *Application*: After the approval or conditional approval of the preliminary plat by the Council, the subdivider may cause the subdivision, or any part thereof, to be surveyed and a final plat prepared in accordance with the approved preliminary plat. The subdivider shall submit ~~to the planning staff the following a completed final plat application form provided by the Director and prescribed by the City Council.:~~
 - ~~1. Final plat application along with a title report that is less than six (6) months old, warranty deed or other acceptable evidence, including but not limited to an affidavit that demonstrates the subdivider's ownership or legal interest in the land included in the final plat.~~
 - ~~2. Payment of fees equivalent to the amount of material and labors expended by city staff for plat review. Fees shall be paid for all costs associated with the review of the preliminary plat, final plat and construction drawings. The subdivider will be notified of the amount owed and the basis for the fees charged. All plat related fees shall be paid prior to city approval.~~
 - ~~3. Three (3) paper copies (twenty four (24) inches by thirty six (36) inches) and a digital copy in a PDF format of the final plat and signature page.~~
 - ~~4. Three (3) paper copies and a digital copy in a PDF format of the final engineering construction drawings for streets, water, sewer, sidewalk, pressure irrigation and other public improvements as provided for in KCC § 5-9-402.~~
 - ~~5. Other items as specified, and required by the City during the application process.~~
- B. *Content of final plat*: The final plat shall be in compliance with all items required in Idaho Code Title 50, Chapter 13; the final plat shall include the following:
 - ~~1. Final plat check off list with all items completed;~~
 - ~~2. Proof of current ownership of the real property by subdivider or written consent of the final plat owners of record;~~
 - ~~3. All easements shall be shown on all lot lines for lots in the subdivision;~~
 - ~~4. All subdivisions that contain a homeowners' association shall have the following language: "The Homeowners' Association (HOA), its ownership and maintenance commitments cannot be dissolved without the express written consent of the City of Kuna, Idaho. All improved individual lots are subject to a fractional share of the irrigation assessment for each HOA common lot(s) that receive(s) municipal~~

~~irrigation. If the assessment is not paid by the HOA, the individual improved lots are subject to a lien for non-payment";~~

- ~~5. Other information the Director, city engineer or city attorney deem necessary to establish ownership and signing authority;~~
- ~~6. A statement and other supporting evidence demonstrating the final plat conform to the approved preliminary plat;~~
- ~~7. A statement of compliance with provisions of this chapter;~~
- ~~8. A statement confirming that the final plat meets established engineering practices and local standards.~~

BC. *Planning staff review:*

1. The Director shall certify, and date stamp the application for purpose of establishing its completeness relative to all noted final plat requirements.
2. The Director shall review the final plat for compliance with the approved or conditionally approved preliminary plat. If the Director or assigned person determines there are substantial differences between the preliminary and final plat, the subdivider may be required to amend for final plat and submit it to the Council as it was portrayed at the time of the preliminary plat process.
3. After the Director's determination that the final plat is in compliance with the preliminary plat and all conditional requirements have been met, the Director or assigned person shall place the final plat on the council agenda within forty-five (45) days from its receipt and acceptance. Acknowledgement of final plat acceptance shall be conveyed by way of written confirmation.

CD. *Agency review:* The Director or assigned person shall transmit final plat documents to other reviewing city staff and agencies for evaluation and comment. The reviewer shall evaluate the final plat improvements for consistency with construction standards, health protocols, cost estimates and legal requirements.

1. *City engineer review:* The city engineer shall review final plats and will not sign the final plat Mylar if any City Code violations exist on the subject property at the time of requested signature. The final plat may not be recorded until signed by the City engineer.

DE. *Council action:* At the public meeting scheduled for the final plat review the Council shall consider comments from agencies. The Council shall approve, approve conditionally, disapprove the final plat or table it for purposes of acquiring and reviewing additional information and then approve, approve conditionally or disapprove the final plat after review of this supplementary information within thirty (30) days of the date of the regular meeting at which the plat is first considered. A copy of the approved plat shall be filed with the Planning and Zoning Department. Upon granting or denying the final plat, the Council shall specify:

1. The ordinance and standards relied upon to evaluate the application;
2. The reasons for approval or denial; and

3. The action(s), if any, the applicant could take to obtain a permit.

EF. *Approval period:*

1. The final subdivision plat shall be filed with the county recorder within two (2) years after the Council's signing of the final written decision, the plat approval shall become null and void unless prior to the two (2) year expiration date the subdivider applies for a time extension as provided in KCC 5-9-205.

FG. *Prior to requesting the city engineer's signature on the final plat Mylar, the developer shall either:*

1. Provide the necessary documentation to show that all required improvements, infrastructure, public utilities, public improvements, have been installed and conditions of approval have been met and inspected and approved by the City; including all record drawing requirements, submittal of engineer or record inspection logs, submittal of the engineer of record certification and receipt of the dedication request, and memorandum from the city engineer has been issued stating as much; or
2. Provide the necessary documentation to show that the required improvements and conditions that have not been completed have approved financial guarantees, as provided for in this section and KCC § 5-9-402.
3. The city engineer shall not sign, nor release the final plat for recording until the City has received the financial guarantee, as provided for in KCC § 5-9-402 in compliance with the provisions of this chapter and the Council has approved the final plat.

GH. The following items are not eligible for financial guarantees as provided for in KCC § 5-9-402 and shall be completed by the subdivider and inspected and approved by the city engineer and/or their legal designee and other approving agencies, prior to the subdivider submitting for final plat approval:

1. Construction of the domestic water system, including successful pressure testing. Bacteria tests and final City of Kuna inspections and approvals may be delayed until roadways are completed;
2. Installation of fire hydrants according to the current International Fire Code standards and supporting fire flows according to standards established by the Fire District;
3. Construction of the sanitary sewer system with evidence of acceptable pipe sloping and, completion of all work within the base of the manholes. However, the pressure test and television camera inspection, followed by any additional City of Kuna inspections and approvals must be completed prior to the paving of the all-weather roadway;
4. Construction of pressurized irrigation to city standards, including successful pressure testing regardless of incorporation into the city's pressurized irrigation system;

5. Construction of permanent roads shall be complete to the extent that all road base is installed such that it provides a temporary all-weather road service to all buildings to be constructed pursuant to subsection G(1) above. These improvements shall be to ACHD and City of Kuna standards and receive the Fire District's approval. If the permanent roads are not improved to this level of completion, then construction of temporary roads with an all-weather road surface shall be installed to service all buildings, subject to approval from the Fire District;
 6. For items 1. through 4. above, the city engineer's approval shall be in the form of a memorandum confirming the completion of the items;
 7. The subdivider shall dedicate all sanitary sewer and domestic water facilities and provide all applicable documentation as required by the city engineer.
- H. The following items may provide the necessary financial guarantees as provided for in KCC § 5-9-402, and as approved by the city engineer, city attorney and Director, and adopted by the Council. The subdivider shall pay any additional fees associated with the request for financial guarantees, as approved and adopted by the Council.
1. Completion of the construction of an all-around weather road system built to ACHD specifications, and subject to the Kuna Fire District and Ada County Highway District (ACHD) inspections and approvals. The City shall review the financial guarantees provided for by and between the developer and ACHD, and the city attorney shall determine if the City's interests are adequately protected.
 2. Installation of street signs followed by city engineer, Kuna Fire District and ACHD inspections and approvals.
 3. Installation of required landscaping, amenities and improvements.
 4. Construction of that portion of the pressure irrigation system that will be dedicated to the city by the subdivider. Said system shall be tested by the subdivider, and inspected and approved by the city's engineering staff.
 5. Provide permanent approved perimeter fencing along the subdivisions outer perimeter, which shall require a building permit.
 6. The city engineer shall monitor the construction of any improvements or conditions that are being constructed pursuant to the financial guarantees of KCC § 5-9-402.
 7. If the city attorney determines that it is necessary, any improvement or condition that is being constructed pursuant to the financial guarantees of KCC § 5-9-402 shall be recorded against the property in a development agreement, as approved and adopted by the city council.
 8. The developer may construct up to three (3) model homes if the project size is up to fifty (50) acres, or up to five (5) model homes if the project size is greater than fifty (50) acres. The developer shall be solely responsible for locating the model home within any required City setbacks and easements. As provided for in subsection 9, below, no certificate of occupancy shall be issued on any of the

model homes until all improvements and conditions that are subject to financial guarantees are completed, inspected and approved by the appropriate agencies.

9. Other than the model homes constructed in subsection 8, no other homes may be constructed, and no certificate of occupancy shall be issued until all improvements and conditions that are subject to a financial guarantee are completed, inspected and approved by the appropriate agencies.

IJ. Prior to the roads being paved and the sidewalks being constructed, the City must receive documentation requesting that the system be annexed into the Kuna Municipal Irrigation System if annexation is applicable. All applicable fees must be submitted with the annexation request. The annexation of water rights to the City in sufficient quantities to offset the subdivisions potential water demands as determined by the city engineer.

JK. *Method of recording:* After the Council grants final plat approval and subject to the prepayment of recording fees, posting an acceptable irrevocable guarantee and the inclusion of the following signatures on the final plat, the applicant shall submit the final plat to the county recorder for recording:

1. Certification and signature of the Council verifying that the subdivision has been approved;
2. Certification and signature of the city clerk, if required, and the city engineer verifying that the subdivision meets the city requirements and has been approved by the Council; and
3. Certification of the sanitation restrictions on the face of the plat pursuant to I.C. § 50-1326.

5-9-602: LOT SPLIT:

A. *Purpose:* A lot split is the dividing of an original lot, tract or parcel of land. A lot split shall not create more than three (3) new parcels from the original lot, tract or parcel of land, including any splits granted by the county prior to annexation into the city. The burden shall be on the property owner to provide evidence that they are eligible for a lot split with the city, by way of a deed and legal description of the tract demonstrating its existence as an original lot, tract or parcel of land and its configuration as of the date of application for lot split.

1. **Compliance:** The owner shall comply with the following conditions:
2. The minimum lot size of all parcels created through the lot split process shall be one (1) acre, except lots created through the public utility lot split process.
3. All parcels created via lot split shall meet lot frontage requirements established in KCC § 5-8-504.
4. **Sewer and water:** Applicant shall extend public sewer and water to each parcel created when public sewer and water are available within three hundred (300) feet of the parcel(s), or as determined by the city engineer.

5. If City sewer and water are not available within three hundred (300) feet of the parcel(s) the Applicant shall comply with the Septic Tanks/Systems standards as established in KCC § 5-9-603.
6. Parcels located in the Kuna Nitrate Priority Area shall not be split without connecting to city sewer and water. A waiver of this subsection may be allowed when the applicant, at time of application submittal provides documentation from Central District Health, that the district's potable water supply and septic system requirements can be met.
7. Land possessing unique features or topographical constraints: Land possessing unique features or topographical constraints may be subject to an environmental review at the director's discretion, which, in turn, may require that certain issues be mitigated.
8. Utilities placed underground: Utilities shall be placed underground, unless it is determined by the owner of the utility and/or the city council that such action is not feasible or reasonable. Parcels created that are more than one (1) acre in size shall be subject to this condition on a case-by-case review basis.
9. Stormwater drainage: Any increased stormwater drainage resulting from lot split activity shall be retained on-site. Parcels less than one (1) acre shall provide stormwater plans and supporting calculations to the city engineer for review and approval. Parcels one (1) acre and larger shall be subject to providing stormwater plans and supporting calculations to the city engineer for review and approval on a case-by-case basis.
10. Fire hydrants and water mains: Each parcel shall be provided fire protection by the lot owner in accordance with fire district standards as determined by the fire chief as a condition of development.
11. Grading or depositing of soil: No grading or depositing of soil shall occur on the parcels within the floodplain or floodway unless the appropriate permits are obtained and approved by the city engineer.
12. Maximum number of parcels created: The maximum number of parcels that can be created from contiguous original tracts, submitted under a single application, is six (6). If more splits than this amount are intended from original and contiguous tracts, that action shall occur through the city's subdivision process.
13. Water rights: Water rights appurtenant to a tract of land, subject to lot split, shall remain with the land or be dedicated to the city. Water rights for the split parcel may not be sold, abandoned, or transferred off the land (except to the city).
14. Dedication of public right-of-way (ROW): The owner shall dedicate public ROW in accordance with the area's identified transportation needs as they may be identified in Ada County Highway District (ACHD) or COMPASS documents, as well as the city's "Comprehensive Plan Street Circulation Map" and in its supporting text. The portion of a parcel included within the right-of-way does not constitute a part of the lot split.
15. Lot split conformity: Parcels shall be divided, or otherwise configured, to accommodate the city and ACHD's transportation grid, utility layout and connectivity patterns.

16. Sidewalks: Sidewalks and landscaping shall be installed in accordance with KCC § 5-10-13 for parcels abutting classified roadways. Where sidewalks are required, the owner shall submit engineering drawings, contractor's estimates, and submit for construction plan review.
17. Driveway entrances: Each parcel created through a lot split shall have a driveway entrance(s) connecting to a public street(s) with adequate driveway distance separations as determined by the city and/or ACHD. Where feasible, the driveway entrances shall be designed and constructed as shared driveways. Owner(s) shall develop driveway agreements for shared driveways and these agreements shall be recorded and follow the land. Shared driveway entrances shall have a minimum driveway width of twenty-four (24) feet, unless ACHD requires a different width. The driveway's asphalt apron and entryway shall extend inward a minimum of fifteen (15) feet from the parcel's property line to minimize the tracking of debris onto the roadways. Driveways shall be a maximum one hundred fifty (150) feet in length. The driveway plans shall be reviewed and approved by the city engineer.
18. ACHD requirements: Prior to construction or installation of any roadway improvements (curb, gutter, sidewalk, pavement widening, driveways, culverts, etc.) a permit or license agreement must be obtained from ACHD.
19. Original lot, tract or parcel of land: A lot, parcel, or tract of land as recorded on any plat or record on file in the office of the county recorder or any unplatted contiguous parcel of land held in one (1) ownership and of record on or before December 7, 1977.
20. Lot of record: A lot which is part of a subdivision recorded in the office of the county recorder, or a lot or parcel described by metes and bounds, the description of which has been so recorded.
21. Owner: The individual, firm, association, syndicate, partnership, or corporation having any interest in the land to be subdivided.

B. *Public Utility Lot Split:*

1. *Purpose:* A public utility lot split is the dividing of a lot, tract or parcel of land for the purpose of creating a public utility lot as defined in KCC § 5-2-3. The burden shall be on the property owner to provide evidence to the director that the public utility lot will exclusively contain public and/or a private infrastructure which is a physical component of an interrelated public or private system which provides water, sewer, irrigation, natural gas, electrical grid and/or telecommunication service to the public.
 - a. The owner of the lot, tract or parcel of land and the utility provider, who will be the owner of the public utility lot, shall file a joint application for a public utility lot division with the Director. At a minimum, the application shall contain the following information:
 - b. Names, mailing and email addresses and phone numbers of applicants; and
 - c. Legal description of the original lot, tract or parcel of land and the proposed Public Utility Lot; and
 - d. Affidavits of legal interests; and

- e. The construction drawings and specifications of the infrastructure to be constructed on the public utility lot ("Subject Infrastructure") for the director's and city engineer's review; with sufficient information about the locations, nature and volume of the interrelated public or private system, which the Subject Infrastructure will be providing water, sewer, irrigation, natural gas, electrical grid and or telecommunication service to the public; and
 - f. Proof that the utility provider applicant owns physical infrastructure systems which provides water, sewer, irrigation, natural gas, electrical grid and/or telecommunication service to the public.
2. *Standards:*
- a. There shall be no minimum lot size that applies to public utility lots.
 - b. Public utility lots will not be subject to setbacks.

- ~~1. An application for lot split shall be filed with the director by the owner for which such lot split is proposed. At a minimum, the application shall contain the following information:~~
 - ~~a. Provide a narrative of the land use action;~~
 - ~~b. Name, address and phone number of applicant;~~
 - ~~c. Legal description of property;~~
 - ~~d. Description of existing land use(s);~~
 - ~~e. Zoning district;~~
 - ~~f. Description of proposed lot split; and~~
 - ~~g. A site plan drawn to a one (1) inch equals one hundred (100) feet scale on eleven-inch x seventeen-inch (11"X17") or greater sheet of paper showing the location of all buildings, parking and loading area, traffic access and traffic circulation, open spaces, landscaping, refuse and service areas, utilities, signs, yards and such other information as the city council or director may require to determine if the proposed lot split meets the intent and requirements of this title.~~

CD. *Process:*

- 1. An application shall be submitted, in accordance with KCC § 5-4.
- 2. Upon tentative approval of the application by the Director and subject to conditions of approval and applicable city ordinances, the owner shall have one (1) year to complete the following tasks:
 - a. Cause the property to be surveyed and a record of survey recorded;
 - b. Execute and record the necessary deeds to accomplish the property split as approved;
 - c. Obtain new tax parcel numbers from the Ada County Assessor's Office; and

- d. Provide copies of the recorded record of survey, recorded deeds, and the new tax parcel numbers to the director.

**ORDINANCE 2025-31
CITY OF KUNA, IDAHO**

“AN ORDINANCE IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 50-328, 50-329 AND 50-329A GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO IDAHO POWER COMPANY, A CORPORATION, AND TO ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, TO CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE IN AND UPON THE PRESENT AND FUTURE STREETS, HIGHWAYS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF KUNA, IDAHO, ELECTRIC UTILITY PROPERTY AND FACILITIES FOR SUPPLYING ELECTRICITY AND ELECTRIC SERVICE TO THE CITY, THE INHABITANTS THEREOF, AND OTHERS FOR A TERM OF 10 YEARS, INCLUDING THE NONEXCLUSIVE RIGHT TO PHYSICALLY LOCATE AND MAINTAIN TELEPHONE, CABLE, FIBER OPTICS OR OTHER COMMUNICATIONS FACILITIES; SETTING FORTH AN AGREEMENT NOT TO COMPETE, RESERVING POWER OF EMINENT DOMAIN; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF FRANCHISE FEES; AND SPECIFYING OTHER LIMITATIONS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE EXERCISE OF SAID FRANCHISE.”

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KUNA, IDAHO THAT;

SECTION 1. The City of Kuna, Idaho (hereinafter called the “City”) hereby grants to IDAHO POWER COMPANY, a corporation, and to its successors and assigns (hereinafter called the “Grantee”) the right (subject to the rights of the City set forth in Section 14 hereof), privilege and franchise for a period of ten (10) years from and after November 1, 2025 (the effective date of this ordinance), however, with the right to amend by mutual agreement in accordance with Section 15, to construct, maintain and operate in and upon the present and future streets, alleys, highways and other public places within the corporate limits of the City, electric utility property and facilities for supplying electricity to the City, and the inhabitants thereof, and to persons and corporations beyond the limits of the City, including the nonexclusive right to physically locate and maintain telephone, cable, fiber optics or other communications facilities of the Grantee or other parties, (provided, that Grantee shall comply with the City’s requirements for cable system franchises) all subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter specified. In the case of annexation of property to the corporate limit, such area will be considered under this agreement, upon effective date of the annexation, subject to Section 9 hereof. All such electric utility property and facilities now maintained by the Grantee within the streets, alleys, highways and other public places within the corporate limits of the City shall be deemed covered by this ordinance as provided herein.

SECTION 2. All of the Grantee’s electric property and facilities in and upon the present and future streets, alleys, highways and public places within the corporate limits of the City shall be constructed and at all times maintained in good order and condition and in accordance with standard engineering practices and all applicable safety codes and lawful governmental regulations, including all applicable state and federal regulations and all construction standards

presently in effect by the Idaho Public Utilities Commission or adopted by that Commission during the term of this franchise agreement.

SECTION 3. Upon request of the City, the Grantee shall relocate its facilities as necessary within the present and future streets, alleys, highways and other public places owned by the City. The City shall have no responsibility for the costs of such relocations. The Grantee shall bear the cost of relocating its facilities at the City's request, unless the facilities are to be relocated for the benefit of a third party, in which case the third party shall pay the costs of relocation. In the event federal, state or other funds are available in whole or in part for utility relocating purposes, the City shall apply for such funds and the Grantee will be reimbursed to the extent any such funds are actually obtained.

SECTION 4. It shall be lawful for the Grantee to make all needful or convenient excavations and/or installations in any of the present and future streets, alleys, highways and other public places within the corporate limits of the City for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the posts, poles, towers, or other supports for its wires or for the purpose of laying, maintaining and operating conduits, vaults and wires and other conductors underground for the purpose aforesaid, or to repair and improve such electric power and light system and to extend the same; provided that when the Grantee or any person or corporation under the authority of this franchise, shall disturb any of said streets, alleys, highways or other public places for the purposes aforesaid, he, it or they shall restore the same to good order and condition as soon as practicable and without unnecessary delay and failing to do so after five days' notice from the City, or its duly authorized officer or officers, then the City may place said street, alley, highway or public place in such condition at the cost and expense of the Grantee, and said Grantee will forthwith pay the full cost and expense thereof upon demand of the City. All facilities constructed under this ordinance shall be placed and maintained at such places and positions in or upon such public ways and public places as shall not interfere with the passage of traffic and shall conform to all applicable laws, rules and regulations.

SECTION 5. If the City wishes to attach City communications facilities to Grantee's poles and related facilities, the parties will enter into the standard Idaho Power Facilities Attachment Agreement, which sets forth the terms and conditions for third-party attachments to Grantee's poles and related facilities, including without limitation facility attachment fees, safety and clearance requirements, and make-ready obligations.

SECTION 6. The Grantee shall at all times indemnify and hold the City, its officers, employees and agents, harmless from any and all expenses or liability arising from, and against or by reason of any negligent act or omission of the Grantee, its representatives or employees, in the construction, operation or maintenance of any of the Grantee's electric utility property or facilities.

SECTION 7. Upon acceptance of this franchise by Grantee and before Grantee shall have any rights hereunder, Grantee shall file with the City Clerk a Certificate of Insurance evidencing General Liability Insurance which covers claims for Bodily Injury, Property Damage and Personal Injury. Such insurance shall have minimum limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

The City of Kuna shall be named as an “Additional Named Insured” under Grantee’s insurance policy. Should the minimum limits of insurance as set forth herein be increased above \$1,000,000, pursuant to the Idaho Tort Claims Act (Idaho Code Section 6-901 et. seq.) or any similar legislation, the Grantee shall be required to provide the City with a new Certificate of Insurance evidencing the higher limits upon the City’s request.

SECTION 8. The electric service to be furnished to the public hereunder, and all rates and charges therefore, and all regulation of the Grantee hereunder, shall at all times be subject to all rules, regulations and orders that may be lawfully prescribed by the Idaho Public Utilities Commission or by any other governmental authority now or hereafter having jurisdiction over such matters. During the term of this franchise, Grantee shall at all times assure that customers within the City have access to customer service from the Grantee as required by the Idaho Public Utilities Commission.

SECTION 9. Upon the effective date of this agreement and continuing through June 30, 2026, as compensation for the right, privilege and franchise hereby granted, Grantee agrees to pay to the City an amount equivalent to zero percent (0%) of Grantee’s “gross revenues” for the preceding calendar quarter. For the calendar quarter beginning July 1 of 2026 and continuing through the remaining term of this franchise agreement, as compensation for the right, privilege and franchise hereby granted, Grantee agrees to pay to the City on or before the 30th day of January, April, July, and October, an amount equivalent to one percent (1%) of Grantee’s gross revenues for the preceding calendar quarter. For purposes of this Section, “gross revenues” shall mean the amount of money billed by the Grantee for the electricity it sells within the corporate limits of the City to customers, less uncollectibles. The City shall provide appropriate information to the Grantee to allow the Grantee to identify which of its customers are located within the corporate limits of the City for purposes of paying franchise fees. Grantee shall not be responsible for any failure to pay franchise fees which results from deficiencies in such information provided by the City. In the event the City annexes a new area into its corporate limits, the terms of this Section 9 regarding franchise fees shall not apply to the annexed area until sixty (60) days after the City has supplied the Grantee with appropriate information for the identification of the Grantee’s customers within the annexed area.

The Grantee’s franchise fee payment obligations hereunder shall commence with the start of the Grantee’s first full billing cycle following the effective date of this ordinance; provided, that the Grantee must first receive approval from the Idaho Public Utilities Commission for the collection of the franchise fee in the rates charged by Grantee.

SECTION 10. The City shall have the right during the term of this franchise agreement to increase the franchise fee hereunder up to three percent (3%), by obtaining the consent of the Grantee or the approval of a majority of voters of the City voting on the question at an election held in accordance with chapter 3, title 50, Idaho Code. Any such vote to increase the franchise fee hereunder shall provide that the increased franchise fee will apply to any electric service provider (other than the City) who utilizes the City’s streets, alleys or other public places to provide electrical service within the City, during the term of this franchise agreement.

SECTION 11. The Grantee shall keep accurate books of account for the collection of the franchise fees for a period of at least three years hereunder and the City shall have the right to inspect the same at all times during business hours, and from time to time audit the same for the purpose of determining gross revenues under Section 9 above.

SECTION 12. The franchise fees paid by the Grantee hereunder will be in lieu of and as payment for any tax or fee imposed by the City on the Grantee by virtue of its status as a public utility including, but not limited to, taxes, fees or charges related to easements, franchises, rights-of-way, utility lines and equipment installation, maintenance and removal during the term of this franchise agreement.

SECTION 13. The Grantee shall have the right and privilege, insofar as the City is able to grant the same, in accordance with National Arborist Association standards, of the pruning of all trees which overhang the present and future streets, alleys, highways and other public places within the corporate limits of the City, in such a manner and to such extent as will prevent the branches or limbs or other parts of such trees from touching or interfering with its wires, poles and other fixtures and equipment. However, except in an emergency, no pruning shall be undertaken without giving the occupant of the adjacent property written or oral notice that such pruning will be performed.

SECTION 14. In consideration of Grantee's undertaking hereunder as evidenced by its acceptance hereof, the City agrees not to engage in the business of providing electric service during the life of this franchise or any extension thereof in competition with the Grantee, its successors and assigns; but nothing herein contained shall be construed or deemed to prevent the City from exercising at any time any power of eminent domain granted to it under the laws of the State of Idaho. The City shall not grant a franchise to another electric service provider during the term of this franchise agreement unless the electric service provider has received approval to provide electrical service within the City from the Idaho Public Utilities Commission, and the City has imposed the same franchise fee on the electric service provider as paid by the Grantee.

SECTION 15. In the event of an amendment to the laws, rules or regulations of the City of Kuna the State of Idaho or the Public Utilities Commission of Idaho applicable to this franchise, or for periodic review of any section of this agreement, the terms of this franchise and the rights and privileges hereby conferred may be changed, altered, amended or modified upon mutual agreement between the City and the Grantee. In all cases, 60 days notice shall be required on the part of City or Grantee to reopen the agreement pursuant to this section.

SECTION 16. Any violation by the Grantee of the provisions of this ordinance, franchise and grant or any material portions thereof or the failure promptly to perform any of the provisions thereof shall be cause for the forfeiture of this franchise and grant and all rights hereunder by the City after sixty (60) days' written notice to the Grantee and the continuance of such violation, failure or default; however, this provision shall not prevent the Grantee from submitting such question of violation or forfeiture to the appropriate forum (which may include the district court having jurisdiction or the Idaho Public Utilities Commission) for determination.

SECTION 17. Sale, assignment or lease of this franchise is prohibited without notification to the City.

SECTION 18. The Grantee shall assume the cost of publication of this franchise as such publication is required by law.

SECTION 19. The Grantee shall within thirty (30) days after final passage of this ordinance, file with the City Clerk its acceptance of this franchise in writing signed by its proper officers and attested by its corporate seal.

SECTION 20. The existing franchise agreement between the City and Grantee set forth in Ordinance #2015-12, dated November 1, 2015, shall terminate upon the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 21. Inasmuch as the Grantee has constructed and now is maintaining and operating the electric utility property and facilities in and upon the streets, alleys, highways, and public places in the City, it is hereby adjudged and declared that this ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and therefore this ordinance shall take effect on November 1, 2025.

SECTION 22. In accordance with Idaho Code Section 67-2346, Grantee hereby certifies that it is not currently engaged in, and during the term of this franchise agreement will not engage in, a boycott of goods or services from Israel or territories under its control as defined in said code section.

SECTION 23. In accordance with Idaho Code Section 67-2359, Grantee hereby certifies that it is not currently, and for the term of this franchise agreement will not be, owned or operated by the Government of China as defined in said section.

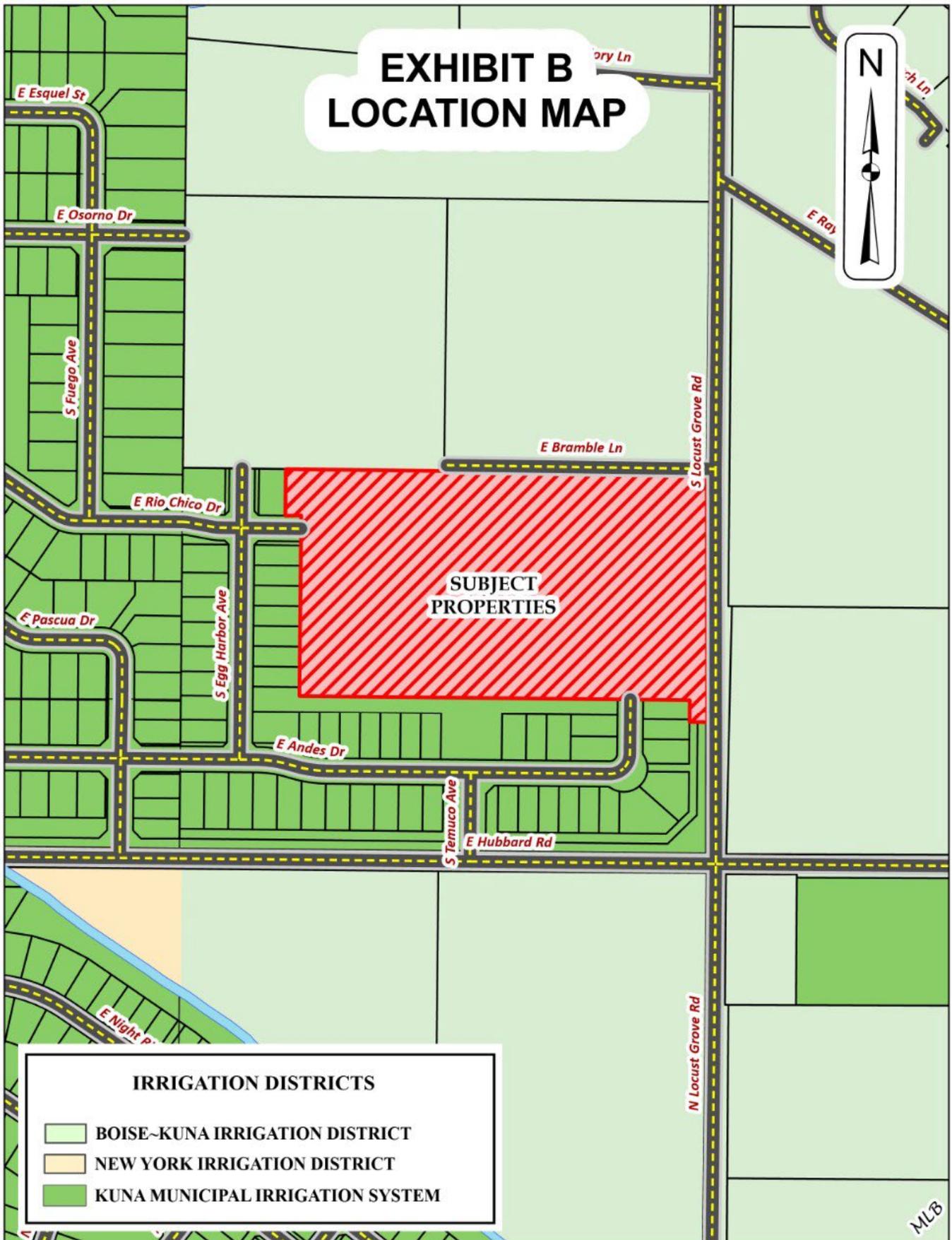
